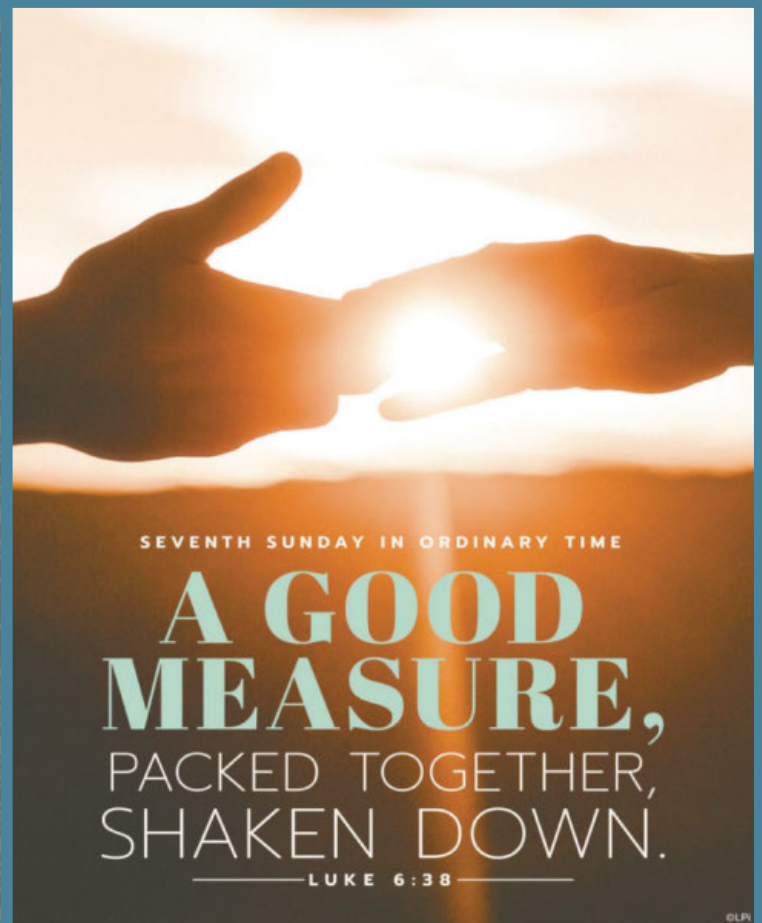

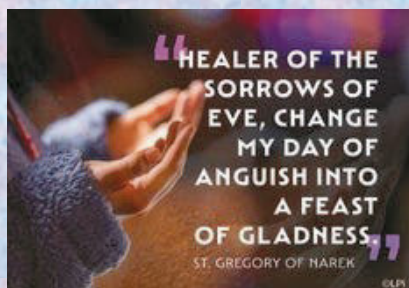

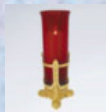

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,



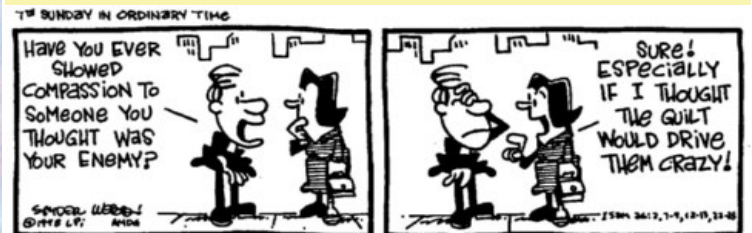
Last week we saw a Jesus that jarred us, one who was not the "warm and fuzzy Jesus" of whom I referred with regards to my seminary training and of whom we often think when we

picture who Jesus is for us. Last week, in the rendering of the Beatitudes, Luke presented a Savior who was not afraid to challenge people's thinking on who was of value in society (poor/rich, hungry/full, weeping/happy. This week's gospel presents Jesus as one who is once again not afraid to defy "conventional wisdom" on the ideas of love and forgiveness.

In today's gospel, which comes on the heels of last week's gospel passage, Jesus tells the listener/reader that for one to be considered a follower of Jesus, one cannot merely live their lives by the dictates of the world. If one is to be a follower of Jesus, one must "rise above the fray" and think (and act) differently than the world – in essence, one must be BETTER than the world. This should not be a radical thought to the Christian, for while we live *in* the world we should never live so much *of* the world that we forget *why* we are here. We are here, Jesus and the Church would tell us, to build up the Kingdom here on earth so that one day we may live in God's Eternal Kingdom. If we are to do this, we must think/act differently. Thus, Jesus speaks of us to "love your enemies... bless those who curse you..." (Lk 6:27-28) and "turn the other cheek" (Lk 6:29, paraphrased), among other things. This is challenging because it makes us seem weak, like "doormats". Quite the contrary, these challenges make us strong – not in the eyes of the world, but in the eyes of God. When we realize that our strength is in God, we are truly free to be the people who God calls us to be, and our "reward will be great" (Lk 6:35).

I realize that when one reads this, one can be disheartened because to live up to these standards can seem impossible. We are reminded in scripture, however, that "with God all things are possible" (Mt 19:26). Our reliance must be on God if we are to "succeed" in living the Christian life. We cannot live as the world lives, even while we live in the world, for our ultimate destiny isn't the world – it's the Kingdom. May we strive to live as "Kingdom People". May we continue to live as Jesus would call us to live, even/especially when it is difficult. May we trust the Lord's promise that He would not leave us abandoned, that He would be with us until the end of the end of time as we know it here on Earth.

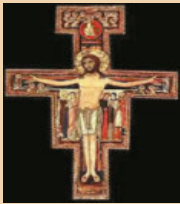


Lenten Mission: Pilgrims of Hope

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today's gospel, Jesus puts forth the radical notion to love our enemies. It is as radical a notion today as it was in Jesus' time, as well as in the time of St. Francis. We are called to do this because "the measure with which you measure will in return be measured out to you." (Luke 6:38). It is a stark reminder to us that however we treat others will be the "measuring stick" that will be used by God to render judgment upon us when we stand before the judgment seat of Christ" (2 Corinthians 5:10). Another key element in all of this is the idea of mercy. Mercy is a concept by which we show compassion or forgiveness towards someone upon whom we can punish or harm. It is, in essence, seeing Christ in them and being Christ for them.

In his "Letter to the Faithful" (which is actually a series of six letters), St. Francis writes this about mercy:

"Let whoever has received the power of judging others pass judgment with mercy, as they would wish to receive mercy from the Lord. For judgment will be without mercy for those who have not shown mercy. Let us, therefore, have charity and humility and give alms because it washes the stains of our sins from our souls. For, although people lose everything they leave behind in this world, they nevertheless, carry with them the rewards of charity and the alms they have given for which they will receive a reward and fitting repayment from the Lord."

In our society, one might look upon this concept as antithetical to living in our society today. How can one show mercy to someone who "deserves" punishment? If I show mercy, what's in it for me? First, the one who "deserves" punishment can also "deserve" mercy, because ultimately God is the only one who can judge. This is not to say that if someone wrongs us they don't deserve to answer for those wrongs; what the concept of mercy does is not allow that punishment to go to the point of vengeance. Secondly, as for what's in it for the person who has the power to enact punishment (or even the one who wants punishment for another) mercy (by the words of St. Francis) "because it washes the stains of our sins from our souls". Also, if one "carry with them the rewards of charity....they will receive a reward and fitting repayment from the Lord".

Jesus calls us to be merciful, and St. Francis echoes this call in his "Letter to the Faithful". May we always be ready to temper justice with mercy, never seeking vengeance but always seeking the conversion of mind, heart, and life of those who have wronged us. May we see with the eyes of Christ (and Francis), and may we feel with the heart of Christ (and Francis). May this mercy be ours as much as it is those upon whom we can bestow it.

Judgment and Love

“Oh, well. I’m going to hell anyway, right?”

I have a few family members and friends who are not practicing Catholics who say this to me from time to time. It’s always spoken in a teasing manner, with a wink and a shoulder shrug, usually to explain away some sort of minor misbehavior they feel guilty about.

It saddens me that Christians have somehow gained this reputation as a people who judge, who condemn. I think in part it stems from a misunderstanding on the part of unchurched people (and lots of churchd ones, too) regarding what constitutes “judging.” It is absolutely not “judging” someone to disagree with a personal decision, whatever that decision may be, or to decline from participating in that decision. We all have functioning consciences; we are all supposed to discern the moral goodness of any action before we take it.

But it is judging someone if we allow their decisions to impact how we treat them.

Today’s Gospel is an invitation for us to consider how we engage with people who disagree with us— or maybe even actively dislike us. Much is said these days of the “culture wars.” I certainly don’t disagree that it can often feel like you’re fighting a war when you’re trying to live as the Church teaches. The forces against you often seem overwhelming and nefarious. And guess what? They are.

But we need to remember who the enemy really is. The enemy is not other children of God, even if they are children of God who are actively promoting ideas that are wrong. Perhaps these people are misguided and mistaken. Perhaps they are misled by the devil. Have we not all been misled by him at some point?


We must interact lovingly with people who think differently and live differently from us. The Christian life absolutely demands it.

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
