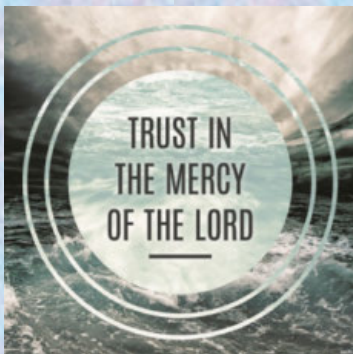

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR



My Dear Friends in Christ,

One can speak of either the “letter of the law” or of the “spirit of the law”. When one looks at the letter of the law, one is speaking of what is written in a legal tome or document; it is literally “black and white” (i.e., there is no “gray area” to be found). When one looks at the spirit of the law, they are looking at intent, circumstances and the desire to find the best outcome. These very different approaches are taken by scribes and the Pharisees and by Jesus, Himself, in today’s gospel passage.

In this passage, a woman is brought before Jesus by the scribes and the Pharisees; she is “caught in the act” of adultery. The law – the letter of the law – is clear: she is to be stoned to death. It is “black and white” with no gray area, at least not in the eyes of the Jewish authorities of the day. There are a few problems with this “black and white” approach – it had to be followed to the letter, and the authorities failed to do so right from the outset. According to Jewish oral law both the man and the woman had to be brought to the temple gates; in this case, only the woman was, thus violating the law. Jesus then bends down to write the law broken (presumably both the breach by the woman and by the Pharisees), which is what He was supposed to do according to tradition, to show everyone (including the authorities) what law had been broken. After doing this, Jesus says that if anyone is without sin they may cast the first stone. The scribes and the Pharisees realize that Jesus knows that they have broken Jewish law (thus have sinned) and have lost their standing to bring this woman to Him, and Jesus is actually giving them an “exit strategy”. The scribes and the Pharisees, one by one, put down their stones and walk away, leaving just Jesus and the woman.

This is where the “spirit of the law” comes in. Jesus, in showing that she is free by the letter of the law, brings her to understand the spirit of God’s “law” of unconditional love and forgiveness. He tells her “Neither do I condemn you. Go, and from now on do not sin anymore” (Jn 8:11). He allows her to resume her life, but with the understanding that she is to live it in the “spirit of the law” by allowing God to work in her life. This incident tells us that it is important to live not only by the “letter” of the law, but by its “spirit” as well. When we live by the spirit of the law, we actually go beyond the letter, fulfilling it as Jesus did and calls us to do. May we have the courage to live and worship in that same spirit of God’s love.

Tenebrae

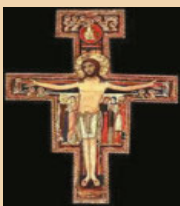
April 15 @ 7 pm St. Ann

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today's gospel deals with the "letter of the law" and the "spirit of the law". In this gospel passage, a woman is accused of adultery and is brought before Jesus after having already faced the scribes and the Pharisees. They presented their case to Jesus, asking His opinion by "framing" it within the Mosaic Law (the Law of Moses). Jesus, realizing that they are trying to trap Him, turns the question around by making the (now) famous statement "Let the one among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her" (John 8:7). He is, in essence, taking the situation from the "letter of the law" to the "spirit of the law". Jesus, having been raised in the temple, would know well the Mosaic Law. But Jesus takes it further, beyond the letter, by putting the onus on the scribes and Pharisees.

St. Francis was a good and noble churchman, one cognizant of the need for Canon (that is, Church) Law. While he was also aware of the need for a "Rule" for his order, he was hesitant to establish one (beyond that which is already written in Canon Law), because he did not want to have the order get "bogged down", as it were, in the letter of the law. For Francis, the Order was about relationships, it was about community, and it was about connection to the world in a practical and visceral way. First written in 1221, Francis established the Rule so that he may be able to establish uniformity and consistency in the way of life of Franciscans. In each "order" of Franciscans, there have been established "rules". This Rule dealt with the First Order, whereas the Rule for the Second Order (the Poor Clares) was established in 1223. For the Secular Franciscan (or Third) Order, a Rule was written in 1221. In all of these cases, the Rule was established to bring order to chaos, uniformity to haphazardness. It was not meant to "hamstring" anyone within a particular order, but merely to bring working parameters to each Order.

While all of these Orders have particular "letters of the law", it is the "spirit of the law" that truly drives Franciscans. As I said before, it's about relationships, community, and making connections to the world. For the Secular Franciscan, it's about "bringing life to Gospel and Gospel to life". It's about taking the rule and applying it to the everyday encounters we have with people in the world. It's about making real connections to the world, both people and nature. Francis would see the Secular Franciscans as truly "hands" and "feet" of Christ in the world, serving our brothers and sisters (as well as caring for the natural world) as would Christ. It's ultimately about Christ and our willingness to go beyond the "letter of the law" and truly explore and incorporate the "spirit of the law" into our everyday lives.

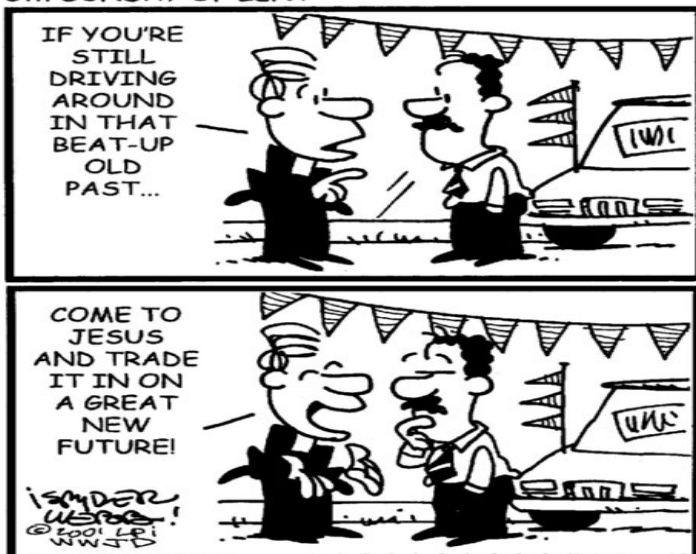

The Allure of Being Right

It wasn't a real question.

"The law of Moses says we should stone her. What do you say?" the Pharisees asked Jesus as they brought the adulterous woman before him. But they weren't really asking. They didn't care what Jesus' answer was. They didn't ask his opinion because they wanted to know. They asked because they wanted to use his words against him.

Righteousness, truth — that wasn't the goal. The goal was being right.

And in the middle of the whole scene, dragged before Jesus, used as a literal prop in this staged drama, is a woman. A real flesh-and-blood woman.

I find myself wanting to know more about her. She had been "caught in the act," they claimed, but I wonder what that even means. With whom was this act committed, and what were the reasons for her participation in it? Was she coerced? Was she scared? Was she confused? Was it really a cut-and-dry, black-and-white situation of adultery, of lust, of making the wrong decision?

We will never know the answers to these questions, and it doesn't matter — it's not our business. God knows the answers. God knows the truth of the matter: what she did, what she chose, what she felt. Because she wasn't a prop to Him. She was a person.

When God looks at us, he sees more than the worst decisions we've ever made.

I worry that we use one another as props even today, when we try like the Pharisees to illustrate "What is Right." We have a terrible tendency to see only decisions, and in doing so we dehumanize the people behind them.
