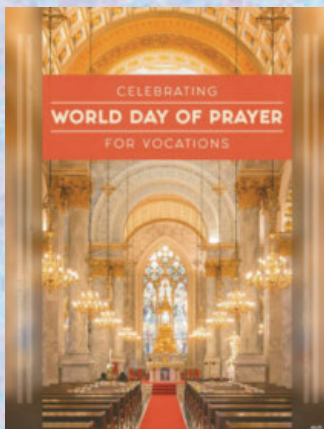

MASSES FOR THE WEEK



My Dear Friends in Christ,

I have a seminary classmate of mine (originally from Greece) whose uncle is a shepherd. Yes, an honest-to-goodness, out-in-the-field shepherd! I asked him one time if the images of the “good shepherd” spoken of by Jesus in the gospels are accurate. He said that they were, especially when Jesus speaking of the shepherd who “lays down his life for the sheep” (Jn 10:11) in his care. A shepherd cares for his flock because they are his livelihood; without them, he does not eat. Yes, he can do other things, but there are some who are called to this profession (just as others are “called” (by a sense of “vocation”). It is more than **what they do** – it is **who they are**.

In this same way, Jesus (*our* “good shepherd”) lays down his life for His flock (you and me). He does this because this is why He came into the world – to lay down His life. Jesus has the power to “lay it down” and “take it up” (Jn 10:18), a power He uses for our benefit. It is the power of the Resurrection at work, once again. We tend to think of the Resurrection as a “one-time event”, and while it is true that it did happen once in time, it is an event that has repercussions which are still being felt today. Each time we celebrate Easter, we remember the gift won for us through the sacrifice of Jesus. Each time we celebrate Mass, we participate in the life, death and Resurrection of Jesus.

Another important aspect of Jesus presenting Himself as the “good shepherd” is the fact that He came into the world for ALL. There are others that “do not belong to this fold” (Jn 10:16), for whom Jesus came into the world as well. These are not only the Gentile communities to whom the Apostles have been/will be sent by Jesus, but also other communities of faith that are still being formed to this day. God is constantly revealing Himself to the world, and Jesus is the “shepherd” who will gather those “flocks”. Jesus will ultimately gather all of those who have chosen to listen to His voice and be part of His “flock”. This will happen at the end of time, when Jesus will separate the world into those who have chosen to follow Him and those who have chosen to ignore Him. Those who have made the decision to follow Him faithfully will be brought into the Kingdom.

So, it seems that we have a choice: We have heard His voice, and it is up to us to follow Him. May we have the courage to “block out” other voices, those contrary to Jesus’. May we always know that as the Lord calls us, His voice is sure and clear. May we, for our part, attune our minds and hearts to that voice. It is a voice that will lead us to Everlasting Life.

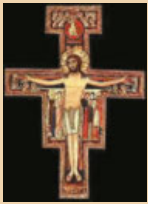

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Speaking to his newly formed community of followers, St. Francis of Assisi used a particular image to express how he wanted the friars to imitate Jesus Christ. In his [Admonitions](#), under the title of “Of the Imitation of the Lord,” St. Francis pointed to the Good Shepherd as the model to be followed:

“Let us all, brothers, consider the Good Shepherd who to save His sheep bore the suffering of the Cross. The sheep of the Lord followed Him in tribulation and persecution and shame, in hunger and thirst, in infirmity and temptations and in all other ways; and for these things they have received everlasting life from the Lord. Wherefore it is a great shame for us, the servants of God, that, whereas the Saints have practiced works, we should expect to receive honor and glory for reading and preaching the same.”

In this passage, St. Francis is referring to Jesus’ own words in the Gospel of John: *“I am the good shepherd. A good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. A hired man, who is not a shepherd and whose sheep are not his own, sees a wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away, and the wolf catches and scatters them. This is because he works for pay and has no concern for the sheep. I am the good shepherd, and I know mine and mine know me, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I will lay down my life for the sheep. I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. These also I must lead, and they will hear my voice, and there will be one flock, one shepherd.”* (John 10:11-16)

St. Francis was pointing out the love Jesus has for his flock and how he was willing to bear any suffering for our sake. He wanted his followers to do the same for the people they encountered, not boasting in their good works, but bearing every burden for the people they serve. Similarly, in referencing this passage, St. Francis may have also been warning his community not to become “hired men,” who leave and run away from their sheep. They were to be “servants of all,” shepherds who would imitate Jesus’ own example. He did not want his brothers to become prideful and consider themselves the source of their good works. Instead, he would repeatedly say that the only thing they could “glory” in was “in our infirmities, and in bearing daily the holy cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.” The Good Shepherd is a beautiful image of Jesus Christ, one that still inspires many sons and daughters of St. Francis.

The Good Shepherd and the Wolf

I remember very clearly the first movie I watched during my pregnancy with my eldest child. In this film, there is a scene where a young boy is kidnapped and shoved into the back of a van guarded by vicious dogs. His mother persists in trying to free him, even as the dogs snap at her. Their bared teeth and full-throated snarls don’t slow her efforts in the slightest.

It wasn’t a great movie or even a particularly great scene, but I’ll never forget this scene. I’ll never forget those dogs.

I had just learned that I was a mother a few days ago. The life growing deep within seemed to me as frail as a whispered secret, but I loved it powerfully. I worried constantly if the baby was safe and healthy. I agonized over signs — real or imagined — that could tell me if the poppyseed-sized child was thriving or failing.

I understood, for the first time in my life, why a woman would charge a pack of attack dogs without hesitation — not because she should, but because she has to.

She could choose not to fight, certainly. She could walk away. But why would she? A future without her son is so much more painful than any physical wound. She may fear for her life, but she fears a life without her child so much more. The Good Shepherd discourse reveals to us the motivation behind God’s actions throughout all of salvation history. From Adam to Noah to Abraham, all the way down to the time of the Messiah and beyond, He keeps trying to get us back. He keeps braving the attack dogs, time after time. He never stops. He never grows weary. And it baffles us: what’s in it for Him? we wonder, because we are quicker to give up on ourselves than He is. Why does He keep trying?

He could choose not to fight, sure. But why would He? He doesn’t want a future without us.

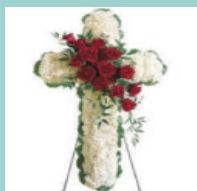

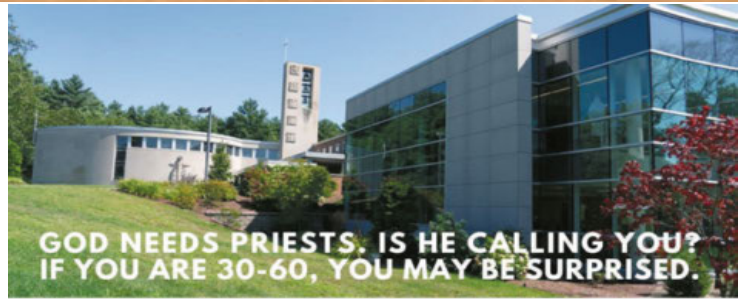
