My Dear Friends in Christ,

There is a poem, the origin of which is attributed to that great poet, "Anonymous" and it goes like this:

"To dwell above with saints we love, That will be grace and glory. To live below with saints we know; Well, that's another story!"

Today, Jesus speaks of the unity that Christians are called to have both with God and one another. It certainly "will be grace and glory" to share in oneness with God in the Kingdom at the end of our earthly days. In order to get there, however, there is the struggle to "live below with saints we know". This was a gift which my mother had, a trait I always admired. As we celebrate Mother's Day on this day, I think of her in particular, and how she had a gift and grace to see the "saint" in everyone (even the most heinous sinner!).

We are, I believe, "saints in training" (a term I first heard, interestingly enough from my mother!). We are being called, constantly, to live out the call for unity not only by God but also by one another, in how we live our lives. In working with the interfaith groups with which I have had the privilege to work over my near-seventeen-year life as a priest, I have come to know some fine men and women who struggle, strive and (more often than not) succeed in living the Christian ethic. Jesus, in today's gospel, reminds in His prayer that we do not belong to the world – we belong to God. If we are to see the Kingdom, it will be by the grace of God, the God who calls us to strive for unity, for oneness, for opportunities to forge bonds with those with similar "goals" as us – the salvation of souls and entrance into the Kingdom.

May we strive to be one as Jesus and the Father are one. May we, in this striving for unity, reach out in love and dialogue to our brothers and sister who seek fullness of life found in the Kingdom. May God continue to place on our hearts His call to "love one another as God has loved us".

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

A very Happy and Blessed Mother's Day to all of our Moms! May your prayers and intentions be answered by our Lord through the intercession of Our Blessed Mother. When we celebrate Mother's Day as a Church, we can't help but think of Mary, the Mother of God, who is universally regarded (by virtue of her life as the Mother of Jesus) as the "Mother of the Church". This is something with which St. Francis of Assisi would wholeheartedly agree.

St. Francis was born in Assisi to Peter Bernadone and Pica de Boulemont, a French noblewoman. By every account of Francis' life, what faith he had as a youth could be credited to his mother, Pica. While his father was caring for the family by running a textile business, his mother was in charge of his education, including his spiritual formation. Pica had a deep faith, and was an ardent practitioner of said (Catholic) faith, something she tried to instill in young Francis. While she was unsuccessful at forming Francis into a like practitioner, one could safely say that it was this foundation which Pica gave Francis that was the catalyst which caused Francis to act upon his faith when in front of the Crucifix at San Damiano and on the road when he encountered the leper.

After his conversion, Francis took what his mother taught him and used it to form the Order of Friars Minor (the Franciscans). Pica was also doubtlessly influential in Francis' decision to place the Order under the protective and loving mantle of Our Blessed Mother. As "Mother of the Church", Mary was seen by Francis as "alter mater" (or, "another mother"). This is something to which I can certainly relate. As a priest, we are called to place our priesthood at the service of God, in the model of Jesus, and under the protection of Mary, the Blessed Mother. Among the many titles of Mary is that of "Mother of Priests". While my relationship with Our Blessed Mother has grown over the years, it really blossomed when I lost my own (biological) mother. It was then that I saw Mary as "alter mater", and have developed a great devotion to her as one who could most profoundly lead me to her Son, Jesus.

May this Mother's Day be a time when we honor not only our earthly Mothers, but our "Spiritual Mother"...Mary, Mother of God, Mother of Priests, Mother of the Church, Our Mother.

In the Church, we observe a liturgical calendar that takes us through the life of Jesus and highlights fundamental doctrines of our faith. Starting with this Sunday, our observance of the Easter Season continues for one more week until the celebration of Pentecost. While many outside of the Church only see Easter as a one-day celebration, we celebrate for an entire season, much like we do during Christmas as well. Of course, this calendar only serves to remind us and point to greater realities.

We are not called to be more generous at Easter or Christmas than we are on other days. We do not choose to love more during one time of the year. The fact is that Jesus is alive right now and at all times is calling us to give of ourselves.

When we make an intentional decision to follow Jesus and adopt a stewardship way of life, we commit ourselves to this journey 365 days a year. We are an Easter people at all times. The high and low points of our journey are not tied to a liturgical year, but instead to our own experiences of life and shortcomings. A season or holiday may make it easier to have a giving attitude, but we need to do the same when little around us is pointing us in that direction. It is sometimes when few are paying attention that love and generosity are most needed.




Monday, May 13


