

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

A few weeks ago, a group of our young people received the Sacrament of Confirmation. In entering into a deeper relationship with God through this sacrament, these young men and women had bestowed upon them a



fresh outpouring of grace which will, please God, give them the strength to take on roles of service in the Church as well as live their lives rooted more deeply in the power of God. The beauty of this Sacrament comes when the bishop, in the laying on of hands and the imposition of Sacred Chrism, asks the Holy Spirit to be with them and give gifts which will help these young people to grow in faith, hope and love,

The Holy Spirit, promised to the apostles in this gospel passage, is couple with another gift: peace. This gift of God's peace, a peace which only God can give, is meant to calm the fears of the disciples as they are given charge of the new entity which will be seen by many as a manifestation of God's love. They are fearful because they feel that they are being abandoned. I know this fear of abandonment and what it looks/feels like each time I leave my dog, Nellie, behind (even for a brief period of time). Her following me to the door is a sign to me that she has a sense of my leaving without the security of knowing that I will return. When I do return, her joy is measurable, palpable! Just as I reassure Nellie that I will return, so does Jesus assure that He will return. Better still, Jesus reassures His disciples that He will not leave them abandoned. This is where the Holy Spirit comes into play.

The advocacy of the Holy Spirit is something upon which we can rely as well. In receiving the Gifts of the Holy Spirit (seven, traditionally, in number but truly as infinite as God Himself), is the power of God at work in our lives which gives us the courage to love as God loves. This love, again like that gift of peace, is a type of love which the world does not/cannot give. The love which the world gives is conditional and finite; the love which God gives is unconditional and infinite. The difference is rooted in God Himself. As the infinite Creator of all that was, is and is to come, God knows what we need before we do. God anticipates those needs and gives us remedies (such as the gifts of the Holy Spirit) to meet those needs.

May God, the giver of all good gifts, allow us to feel the power of the Spirit at work in our lives. May the love of God, which surpasses all known love, take root in our hearts and bear great fruit. May the Holy Spirit given at Baptism, Pentecost, and Confirmation, enflame our hearts with a love of God and God's people. May we have no fear of what the world can do to us, secure in the knowledge that God will not leave us abandoned.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

As we move through the Easter Season, with Pentecost fast approaching, Jesus speaks to his Apostles (and to us) about the gift of the Holy Spirit that they are about to receive – whether they realize it or not! St. Francis spoke of the Holy Spirit in very practical terms on how to receive and use the Spirit. So-called spiritual gurus of every age promote techniques by which a person becomes "spiritual." Contrast this to the perennial wisdom of Saint Francis. One acquires the Holy Spirit, says holy Francis, not by techniques but by simple consistency in penance, prayer, alms, purity, and charity. Such persons will gain the Holy Spirit "permanently." Is this not that for which we long? Here are Saint Francis' words on the subject:

"Furthermore, let us produce worthy fruits of penance. Let us also love our neighbors as ourselves. Let us have charity and humility. Let us give alms because these cleanse our souls from the stains of sin. Men lose all the material things they leave behind them in this world, but they carry with them the reward of their charity and the alms they give. For these they will receive from the Lord the reward and recompense they deserve. We must not be wise and prudent according to the flesh. Rather we must be simple, humble and pure. We should never desire to be over others. Instead, we ought to be servants who are submissive to every human being for God's sake. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on all who live in this way and persevere in it to the end. He will permanently dwell in them. They will be the Father's children who do his work. They are the spouses, brothers and mothers of our Lord Jesus Christ." ("Letter to the Faithful of St. Francis of Assisi")

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque once asked which saint besides the Immaculate Mary in Heaven was the closest and most devoted to the Sacred Heart of Christ our Lord. God revealed that it was Saint Francis. St. Maximilian Kolbe concluded from this that Francis is the closest to the Sacred Heart because he is the saint most like the Blessed Virgin Mary. My suspicion is that this is so because Mary is the humblest creature ever created and Saint Francis also sought this special gift of humility. May the gifts of the Holy Spirit be ours in abundance, and may we use them by incorporating them into our daily lives. May we be devoted to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, shown in St. Francis' love for all creation, and may we (as is said in the Franciscan tradition) "live simply so that others may simply live". Let us live in simplicity, humility, peace, and love.

POPE LEO XIV

Otherwise known at Robert Prevost, born in Chicago in 1955 to parents of Spanish and Franco-Italian descent. Leo served as an altar boy and was ordained in 1982.

He is the first American to fill the role of pope, although he is considered as much a cardinal from Latin America because of the many years he spent as a missionary in Peru. Pope Leo XIV greets the faithful and the world invoking peace and pledging to work for a united Church faithful to Jesus and to the gospel.

Pope Leo XIV: "Peace be with all of you all!"

Dear brothers and sisters, these are the first words spoken by the risen Christ, the Good Shepherd, who laid down His life for God's flock. I would like this greeting of peace to resound in your hearts, in your families, among all people, wherever they may be, in every nation and throughout the world. Peace be with you! ...

In his first public remarks as Pope, Leo introduced himself as an Augustinian—an order within the Catholic Church that follows the teachings of St. Augustine of Hippo, which emphasizes <u>love</u>, <u>harmony</u>, <u>humility</u> and <u>dedication</u> to the spiritual community of the church.

What did the Pope say in his first speech? Leo suggested that he would follow in Francis' footsteps. The late Pope was largely seen as a transformational figure who took the church in a progressive direction and focused on promoting the rights of the poor and marginalized.

In his final Easter message, days before he died, Francis called for peace and disarmament.

When it comes to Popes, names matter. New pontiffs often choose new names as a tribute to as saint or predecessor.

The last Leo to lead the church, Pope Leo XIII, championed the rights of workers.




