

My Dear Friends in Christ,



Ten weeks...TEN! This is how long our local church went without public celebration of the Eucharist. When we came together on Trinity Sunday, it was as if a great weight had been lifted off of our shoulders. While we still have the restrictions of capacity and social distancing (a phrase, I am convinced, which will be the "Word/Phrase of the Year"!), we are now able to join in public worship to share in the Eucharist. We are a Eucharistic People, people whose lives as Catholic-Christians centers on the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ. This, above all else, makes us who we are. In celebrating the Eucharist, heaven and earth are joined and the angels and saints share this moment of faith and worship in which we commemorate the Real Presence of Jesus alive in our Church, our world, and our hearts.

Today, we as a Church celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, more commonly known to us as "Corpus Christi". This is one of my favorite Holy Days, one that is powerful both in its complexity and simplicity; complex due to its "mysterious" nature and simple due to it being present here and now. I love this solemnity not only because of its centrality to our faith (which gives said faith credence and strength), but because it brings, to the forefront, our belief that Jesus is still with us today. Jesus promised His disciples (and us) that He would not leave us abandoned. The Eucharist is proof of that promise. When we gather as a Eucharistic People around God's altar at Mass, at the heart of that liturgical and sacramental moment is the "transubstantiative" moment when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, and Jesus is *truly present* in that moment.

The Body and Blood of Christ are food for our journey of faith, and give us strength to face the challenges that life might present. Jesus, in the gospel, tells us that His "flesh is true food... (His) blood is true drink" (Jn 6:55). I know I wouldn't be able to have the level of strength I do in facing the challenges of life without Jesus being "at the heart of it all", giving me/us that "true food...true drink" (ibid). Jesus suffered in this life and so do we; Jesus overcame suffering (and even death) and so can we – because He is with us! May we know Jesus' Presence in Eucharist, may we believe in that Presence, and may we share that Presence with all whom we meet!

Interesting Flag Day Facts

On June 14, 1777, the Second Continental Congress took a break from writing the <u>Articles of Confederation</u> and passed a resolution stating that "the flag of the United States be 13 stripes, alternate red and white," and that "the union be 13 stars, white in a blue field, representing a new constellation."

In 1916, <u>President Woodrow Wilson</u> marked the anniversary of that decree by officially establishing June 14 as Flag Day. As you celebrate the anniversary of the Stars and Stripes, here are some fast facts about "Old Glory."

Bernard Cigrand, a small-town Wisconsin teacher, originated the idea for an annual flag day, to be celebrated across the country every June 14, in 1885. That year, he led his school in the first formal observance of the holiday. Cigrand, who later changed careers and practiced dentistry in Illinois, continued to promote his concept and advocate respect for the flag throughout his life.

It is widely believed that Betsy Ross, who assisted the Revolutionary War effort by repairing uniforms and sewing tents, made and helped design the first American flag. However, there is no historical evidence that she contributed to Old Glory's creation. It was not until her grandson William Canby held an 1870 press conference to recount the story that the American public learned of her possible role.

In the 1950s, when it seemed certain that Alaska would be admitted to the Union, designers began retooling the American flag to add a 49th star to the existing 48. Meanwhile, a 17-year-old Ohioan named Bob Heft student borrowed his mother's sewing machine, disassembled his family's 48-star flag and stitched on 50 stars in a proportional pattern. He handed in his creation to his history teacher for a class project, explaining that he expected Hawaii would soon achieve statehood as well. Heft also sent the flag to his congressman, Walter Moeller, who presented it to President Eisenhower after both new states joined the Union. Eisenhower selected Heft's design, and on July 4, 1960, the president and the high school student stood together as the 50-star flag was raised for the first time. Heft's teacher promptly changed his grade from a B- to an A.

And when you have the privilege to take that Real Presence into your body at the meal where you are an honored guest, you become one with the One who is the embodiment of stewardship.

Then, you must ask yourself, "How can I even begin to reflect the love that I have encountered at this feast?" The answer is you can begin with the simple actions of the day: where will you go, whom will you meet, and in what work will you partake? Jesus Christ has shown that the greatest gift ever given can be disguised in this world in a piece of bread. By joining your body to his, he can now transform human hearts, not by grand acts, but by everyday acts, by everyday people, practicing Everyday Stewardship.

REST IN THE LORD'S LOVE TONIGHT

Take a few moments to become aware of God's presence. Close your eyes and take a few deep breaths, remembering that in this very moment you are under the gaze of God, who knows and loves you totally.

Bring to mind something that you will face in this upcoming week. It could be something that you're excited, worried, or unsure about. It could be an event, a relationship, a problem, a task, or responsibility. It could be anything.

A reading from the Word of God:

Love is patient, love is kind, and is not jealous; love does not brag and is not arrogant, does not act unbecomingly; it does not seek its own [will], is not provoked, does not take into account a wrong suffered, does not rejoice in unrighteousness, but rejoices with the truth; bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things. (1 Cor. 13:1ff)

Ask yourself: How is God inviting me to live this week?

Notice what arises within you. It could be a feeling, an image, a word, a memory, anything.

Slow down and wait for this feeling, image, or word to become clearer for you. Become fully aware of it and sit with it for a few moments.

Then, in the sanctuary of your baptized soul (which is the temple of the Holy Spirit) **speak to that Divine Spirit**, saying to Him: O Holy Spirit, beloved of my soul, I adore You. Enlighten me, guide me, strengthen me, console me. Tell me what I should do; give me Your orders. I promise to submit myself to all that You desire of me and to accept all that You permit to happen to me. Let me only know Your Will. (Cardinal Mercier's Prayer to the Holy Spirit)

After a few moments of stillness, return to the situation under consideration and see how it may have shifted, even subtly.

Again, slow down and gently wait for an image, word, or feeling to come into awareness that perfectly expresses what is at the core of your present experience.

Place this in a package and hand it to Jesus.

End your time of prayer with an Our Father, entrusting to God all that will happen during this upcoming week.

Let your thoughts be our thoughts.

Let your pain be our pain.




