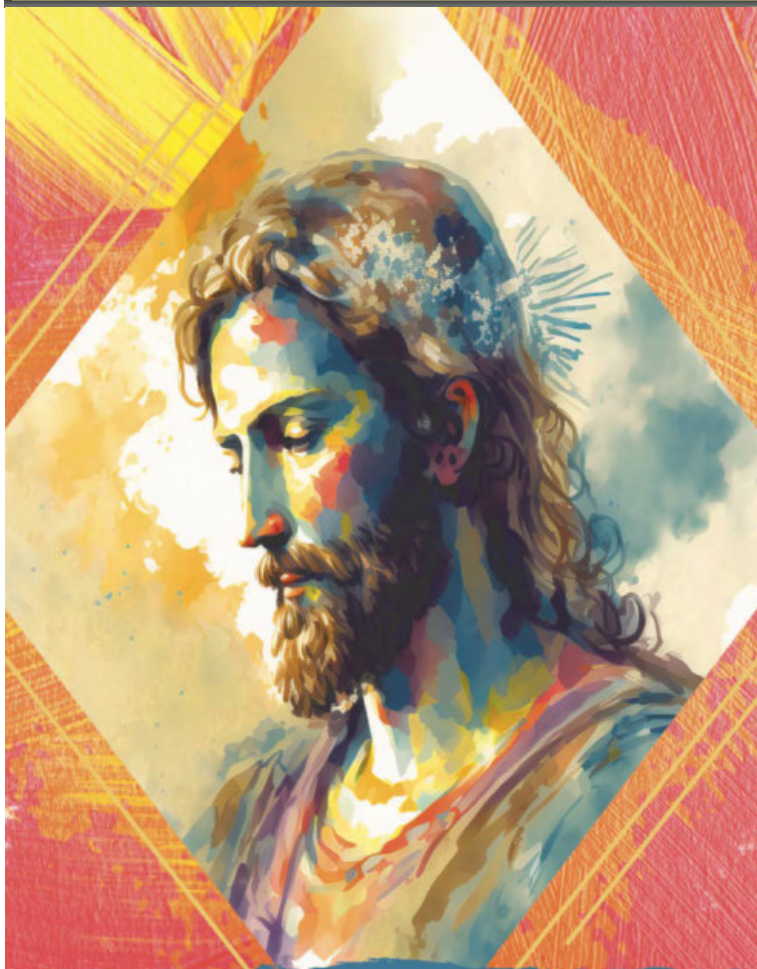

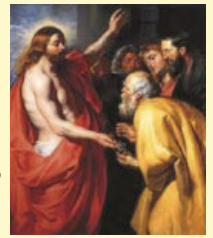

My Dear Friends in Christ,

A few years back, there was a country song put out, popularized by Kenny Chesney, called “Everybody Wants To Go To Heaven” which says that “everybody wants to go to heaven...but nobody want to go now”. It speaks to the fact that many folks want to enter into the Kingdom, but few (if anyone) want to go before they’ve lived all the life they feel that have coming. There’s only one thing wrong with that kind of thinking – it’s not up to us!

Peter speaks up in today’s gospel, voicing this kind of thinking. When he pulls Jesus aside and cautions against the kind of talk Jesus is uttering, he is thinking in human terms and loses sight of the mission of Jesus – the Kingdom. Jesus rebukes Peter (rightfully so), as the mission of Jesus is to end in His death. Jesus knows this and is not afraid to face the reality of this. Jesus realizes that He must die so that we might have life – Eternal Life. This is the “end goal” of Jesus’ mission here on earth, that we might see the Kingdom. This is the mission of each one of us as Catholic-Christians as well, that of the Kingdom.

The reality of the Christian life is that we must die to self so that Christ might live in us. This is a hard reality for many, for it goes “against the grain” of the thinking in modern society. We live in a world that seeks to preserve and prolong life, which is not a bad thing, necessarily. Another issue of recent years has been the push for assisted suicide (euphemistically called “physician-assisted death”). The problem with these ways of thinking come when it gets in the way of God’s plan for us and for the world. God’s desire is for us to have life, life eternal in the Kingdom. This isn’t possible if we strive to live forever in this present reality. We are not meant to live forever in this reality; one day, we are meant to enter into the Kingdom. As it is with Jesus, the “timeline” for this is not up to us; it is for our Heavenly Father to decide. It is God who knows “the day and the hour” of our going home to the Kingdom.

May we have the courage to give ourselves over to God’s plan. May we come to know that plan in our lives and may we strive to live that plan as best as we can. May we have the strength to unite our will over to God, not relinquishing the free will God gives us but aligning it with the plan which God has for us – life eternal in the Kingdom.

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

On Pentecost Sunday of 2015 (5/24/15) Pope Francis promulgated “Laudato Si’ (On Care For Our Common Home). This powerful encyclical laid out challenges that we face and need to address, as well as suggestions of what we could do to ensure that our planet, our earthly home, could be cared for

better. This document was certainly in line with Pope Francis’ ethos, as well as how St. Francis of Assisi (from whom the Pope drew his name) saw the earth. In his “Cantic of the Sun”, St. Francis’ anthropomorphizing of natural elements elevated them to gifts from God, gifts of which we need take care.

On September 1, 2023, Pope Francis called for the recognition of a “Season of Creation”, taking place from 1 September-4 October (not coincidentally the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi). Along with the Pope’s call for the celebration of this Season of Creation, the Laudato Si’ Movement (www.laudatosimovement.org) is spearheading things that we can do to highlight this Season. This is something that St. Francis would most certainly be behind, as he saw the earth as not only a place to reside, but truly a gift from God which is to be cared for, nurtured, and protected. The Church calls upon us to be “stewards of creation”, something which our “first parents” (Adam and Eve) failed to do, and something at which we could be better. When one looks around at the overall condition of the planet, one could make a fair assumption that we have “dropped the ball” when it comes to this stewardship. Certainly, we have things like Earth Day (on 22 April) but truly each day is meant to be “earth day” as this “common home” (as Pope Francis would call it in his encyclical) is the only one we have until we reach the Kingdom.

I leave you with the prayer for our earth, with which Pope Francis concludes Laudato Si’, composed by His Holiness, Pope Francis, and I pray that our stewardship of our “common home” may be done prudently, wisely, and well. Here is said prayer:

A prayer for our earth

***All-powerful God, you are present in the whole universe
and in the smallest of your creatures.
You embrace with your tenderness all that exists.
Pour out upon us the power of your love,
that we may protect life and beauty.
Fill us with peace, that we may live
as brothers and sisters, harming no one.
O God of the poor,
help us to rescue the abandoned and forgotten of this
earth,
so precious in your eyes.
Bring healing to our lives,
that we may protect the world and not prey on it,
that we may sow beauty, not pollution and
destruction.
Touch the hearts
of those who look only for gain
at the expense of the poor and the earth.
Teach us to discover the worth of each thing,
to be filled with awe and contemplation,
to recognize that we are profoundly united
with every creature
as we journey towards your infinite light.
We thank you for being with us each day.
Encourage us, we pray, in our struggle
for justice, love and peace.***
