

My Dear Friends in Christ,

It has often been said that one must not only "talk the talk", but "walk the walk". This expression is so well known that we perhaps take its power for granted. It reminds us that when it comes to the important things of life, we must do more than pay "lip service" to them, but truly invest ourselves in the endeavors which are worthwhile, good and will bring about lasting and life-changing effects.

Jesus, in today's gospel passage, compares prostitutes and tax collectors to chief priests and elders. On the surface, it may seem obvious on whose side a religious authority figure would be. It would seem obvious that someone who had the spiritual well-being of the people in mind would side with the latter group, the chief priests and elders. Jesus, in defying convention here, sides with the prostitutes and tax collectors. We may not be shocked at this, but I'm sure the elders to whom Jesus was offering this parable were not only shocked, but offended. How could Jesus not side with them? How could Jesus say that tax collectors and prostitutes would enter into the Kingdom before priests and elders? It all goes back to "walking the walk".

The chief priests and elders were great at offering sage advice on how to grow closer to God. One is to follow the rules (which are important, let's not forget that!) by doing things like worshipping in temple (a good idea, indeed!), tithing (another good idea!) and the like. The problem was that they, themselves, in following these rules did so with unclean hearts. Their motivation wasn't to grow closer to God – it was to win esteem in the eyes of men. The difference is that tax collectors and prostitutes were already thought of as "less than" by society (especially by religious elders), and no one could see beyond their human appearance. No one except for God, of course! God does not judge by human appearance, by externals. God sees into the heart – into our desires, our motives and our motivations. God sees what we truly desire.

The tax collectors and the prostitutes were seen as "secondclass citizens". Many of our brothers and sisters are put in this category, and perhaps we have been guilty ourselves of putting them there. May we strive to see as God sees – as God sees others, as God sees ourselves. May we be quick to forgive, slow to judge. May we strive to know as God knows, to see as God sees and to love as God loves.

If your teen would like to do a reading or bring up the gifts, please email Matt Brady.


October Family Mass

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Conversion is one of those experiences that happen over a period of time, oftentimes a lifetime. For people like tax collectors and prostitutes it happens when they see, meet, and get to know Jesus. One would hope that for the chief priests and elders of Jesus' day, conversion would have already happened by the time Jesus comes on the scene but, alas, this isn't the case. They don't seem to have a grasp as to what Jesus offers and the gift that He is for the world.

One could say that St. Francis' conversion happened at different points over time. It happened when he knelt in front of the Crucifix in San Damiano. It happened when he encountered the leper on the road. It happened in the town square of Assisi when he renounced all of his worldly goods (literally, stripping himself naked in front of his father and the Bishop!). This conversion continued to happen over the course of his ministry in establishing the Franciscan Order. No doubt he came to a deeper understanding of his calling from God as he taught the Brothers and led them into the Order. He also came to understand what it was God was calling him to do over time, with one of the final moments of conversion being when he received the Stigmata (the wounds of Christ) before finally being called Home by the Lord to the Eternal Kingdom.

These moments of conversion all led St. Francis to a deeper understanding of who he was in the world, who he was in the eyes of his Brothers, who he was in the eyes of God. Where is it that God is calling us to conversion, to a deepening of our relational understand-

conversion, to a deepening of our relational understanding of God? May we come to know God in the simple and profound moments of our life. May we, like

St. Francis, be open to these moments of conversion by giving our will, intellect, and very selves over to God... this day, and every day of our lives!

Saturday 10/14 at 9:30 am at St. John




Forrest Gump Movie Night


