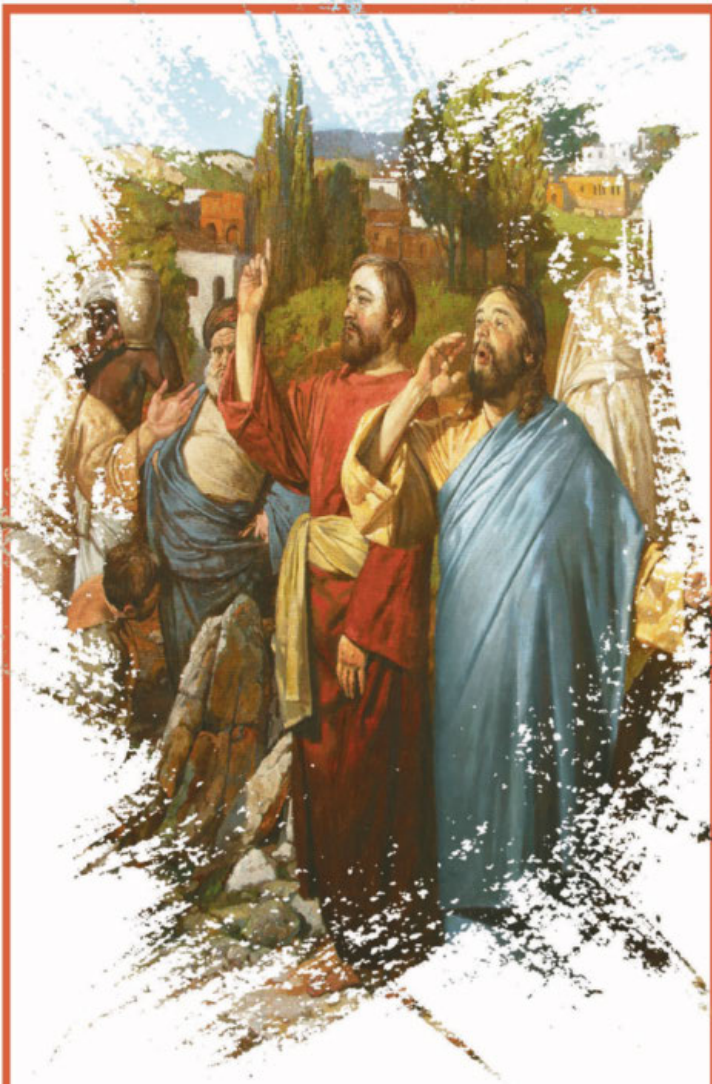

If you are in need of the Sacrament of the Sick, please contact the Rectory to make an appointment for a visit from a Priest.

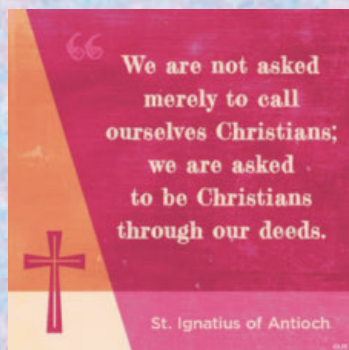

Recently, we have had a bit of a black cloud over the Rectory at St. John's.

The hot water tank let go in the basement which flooded the basement and during a recent wind storm the wind got hold of the side door and ripped the closers off the door and destroyed the door frame as well.

With the cost of water remediation in the basement, a new hot water tank and a new door and frame we have accumulated a total cost of \$4,300.00.

While you as parishioners have been extremely generous, we unfortunately, still do not have the necessary funds for such an amount.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

As you might imagine, in celebrating the number of weddings which I do, I get invited to a lot of “wedding feasts”. In accepting these invitations, I only make one request of the bride and groom – you may seat me anywhere you want...except the head table. It’s not that I don’t appreciate the invite or a “seat of honor”, but what inevitably happens is that I end up either sitting alone (while the wedding party is mingling) or (as has actually happened) I end up cutting the flower girl’s/ring bearer’s food! Therefore, I graciously accept the fact that I have been found “worthy”, but ask this simple favor for the good of all.

In today’s gospel, the Kingdom of God is likened to a wedding feast. In the parable put forth by Jesus, there are some who refuse the invitation put forth by the king. They are then given a second invitation, with the enticements of a good meal (the “fattened cattle”). Some still ignore the invitation; some lay hands on the messengers and kill them. This is how it is with the chief priests and elders; they have heard from the prophets sent by God, yet they choose to either ignore them or put them to death. The invitation is then given to others, but there are still “caveats” involved. Those who are invited must “dress” appropriately, with the proper “wedding garment”. And what is this “wedding garment”? It is not anything physical, but more of an “attitude”, a way of living. One must live in accordance to what God desires of us.

The problem with the chief priests and the elders is that they didn’t know what God desired of them. They certainly knew the Law (of Moses), and they most definitely didn’t have any problem administering that law. The problem came when they were measured with that standard – this is where they fell short; they heard the Word of God, but didn’t apply it to their own lives, for they thought that they were “above the law”.

So where do we fit in to this parable? We have heard the Word of God; have we tried to apply it in our lives? We strive to follow Jesus; have we worked each and every day, wearing our “wedding garment” and showing the world what it means to be a Christian? May we have the courage to not only hear God’s invitation, but respond to it wholeheartedly. May we come to know God’s love, live in that love, and share it with all whom we meet.

If your teen would like to do a reading or bring up the gifts, please email Matt Brady.


October Sandwich Making for Capuchin Mobile Ministries

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

I have no doubt that if St. Francis had continued on the earthly “trajectory” of a merchant nobleman, he would have wed. Recently, I concelebrated a wedding and it was a very nice evening. The bride looked lovely (don’t all brides?), the groom looked handsome (he was a young man who I have known since he was an altar server of mine in my first parish), and the reception was simple but elegant. The thing that struck me is the fact that the central piece of the evening was the Nuptial Mass. The bride and groom seemed to put as much thought into the Wedding Mass as they did the reception which followed.

Why do I mention this? Simply this: In his conversion, St. Francis went from worrying about things like earthly wedding feasts to the heavenly wedding banquet. He went from being consumed by the things of this world to being consumed with eternal life. He went from loving the world (and putting that first) to loving God (and putting Him first). Today’s gospel presents the Heavenly Kingdom of God as a wedding banquet to which guests are invited by the king to partake. When they refuse the king’s invitation, the king takes steps to “widen the circle” of invitation. Some might think that when Francis experienced his conversion, he saw it as invitation to take part one day in the eternal wedding banquet.

St. Francis was certainly someone who knew his way around in the world. As a merchant, he would have been exposed to business and commerce. As a soldier, he would have been exposed to a regimented way of life. As a spiritual convert and a founder of a religious order, he used these things to help his brothers to be “in the world but not of the world”. St. Francis recognized the balance between work and prayer, and he encouraged his brothers do the same, balancing work and prayer. May we strive, like St. Francis, to be “in the world but not of the world” and may we work towards that balance of the two so that we may find ourselves one day in the Heavenly Kingdom.

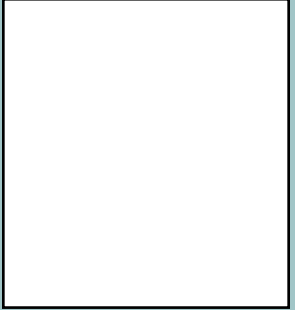
