NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

I have a friend of mine who I've known since college who is blind from birth. He would tell you, if asked, "I'm not sight-



impaired, visually-challenged or optically-absent (a term which brought him no shortage of amusement, actually!)... I'm blind". Blindness, he would tell you is not something which he has had to deal with since he knows no other way. He would also tell you that it hasn't stopped him from achieving his life goals, such as getting a degree, getting married or raising children – he's done all three, and quite well.

The "man born blind" in today's gospel, Bartimaeus, would probably tell a different story. Bartimaeus has had to resort to begging, no doubt because he has be ostracized by the community. Blindness (any illness, for that matter) was associated with sin, and so Bartimaeus is seen as a sinner. He is probably pitied by some, but most likely reviled by most (as a sinner). When Bartimaeus hears that Jesus is coming his way, and he knows that this is his opportunity for healing. You know that he knows who Jesus is by the way he calls out to him, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me" (Mk 10:47). In acknowledging Jesus as "son of David", Bartimaeus is recognizing the "kingship" of Jesus. He is also recognizing Jesus as the Messiah, for the Messiah was to come from the Davidic line. It all comes together for Bartimaeus in that moment. Bartimaeus springs into action, and throws himself at the feet of Jesus with the simple, yet profound, request that he wants to see.

In making the request for sight, Bartimaeus is not only looking for physical healing, but spiritual and social healing as well. Bartimaeus knows that if his sight is restored, he can rejoin the community. Bartimaeus knows that Jesus can do this, as he refers to Jesus as "Master" (Mk 10:51); in doing this, Bartimaeus knows that Jesus is the "key" to healing. Jesus is the key to healing for us, as well. Where is it, in our lives, that we need healing? Where are the "blind spots" in our lives, those things which keep us from being all that we are called to be?

May we have the courage to know that Jesus can heal us. May we trust that this healing is what we need to be restored to fullness in the community. May we, like Bartimaeus, acknowledge Jesus as "Master" for us, our Church and the world.


November Sandwich Making for Capuchin Mobile Ministries

MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today's Gospel deals with Jesus' encounter with Bartimaeus, a blind man who wishes to see (Mark 10:46-52). In ancient times, blindness was among those conditions which were linked with sin. If one was blind, crippled, or leprous, there was a presumption of sin involved with the person. We believe, with our contemporary understanding, that God does not cause disease/illness because of sin. God does allow for such conditions for reasons which are, by and large, beyond human understanding. This is especially true with someone who is seen by most as a good person, begging the question "why do bad things happen to good people".

I mention this gospel passage in light of St. Francis' encounter with the Leper. Francis grew up in a time when there was a large gap between the rich and the poor. At the top were the nobles and rich merchants; at the bottom, the poor and the lepers. During his youth, Francis was taught to be charitable to the poor, but everyone feared lepers. Leprosy was a disease that rotted the extremities of the body, leaving the victim with ugly, oozing sores that smelled and looked terrible. Those with the disease were forbidden to enter the town and were banished to colonies outside the walls. They wore bells around their necks to warn travelers to get off the road when they were coming. Needless to say, they were not treated well by the townspeople.


As a teenager, Francis longed to become a knight. In this way he would win fame and fortune while protecting his town from other, more aggressive neighbors. While traveling to battle, he had a vision from God, which caused him to rethink everything that he was doing. In the vision, he was told to return to Assisi and listen for what God wanted him to do. One day, while Francis was riding a horse through the local countryside, he encountered a leper. The legend tells us that Francis, realizing that the leper was a child of God just like himself, and therefore his brother, got off his horse and embraced him.

In order for Francis to do this, to embrace the leper who was so different from himself, he had to put aside many things that he had been taught and stereotypes he had held about different groups. He had to undergo a conversion from who he was to who God wanted him to be. This begs an answer to some questions for us, today: Who are the "lepers" in society that we can embrace, yet make us feel uncomfortable? How can we overcome this discomfort, this "spiritual blindness", so as to "see Christ in them" and "be Christ for them"? How do we bring about that conversion in our lives so as to make true and lasting change in ourselves, in others, and in the world?




