



NOTES FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

There has been, for the longest time, what could be called "end-time phobia". It is the panicked approach by some that



"The End Is Near" (as I saw on a placard in downtown Boston once). This "visionary" approach is usually paired with some "doomsday scenario" taken either from the Book of Revelation or the mind of movie director James Cameron – take your pick! Well, here it is – the year 2024; it is almost a quarter century past the predictions of "Y2K" and what would follow and we're still here.

My point in bringing up all of these end-of-the-world scenarios is not to dismiss the fact that the world will end. Regardless of the "when", the "if" of the matter hardly up for debate; by all accounts, spiritual and secular, the world will end. In today's gospel, Jesus prepares His followers for the fact that the world, as we know it, will cease at some point. What Jesus does not reveal is the "when" of the event, for it is only in the mind and heart of God the Father and, as my mother would say, "God only knows, and He ain't tellin'!" This should not worry us, but it should serve as a reminder to us that each day is a gift, and that we should indeed work as if each day was our last. In that way, we fulfill the prayerful mandate of the "Our Father" that we make "thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven". The "Lord's Prayer" reminds us, in this stanza, that the day/date/ time of the "parousia" (the "end time") should not concern us. What should concern us is that we are building up God's Kingdom here on earth as best we can, by being God's good and faithful service, reaching out to those in need, lifting the downtrodden and assisting those who are in need of God's mercy and love to find it in us, God's faithful servants.

Today's readings speak of the "end times" – what they will look and feel like, how they will come about for all, believers and non-believers alike. We would do well to heed these words, to put our faith not in human beings but in God, and work so that when the end comes (as it surely will) we are found ready to be welcomed into God's Kingdom. Jesus promises us that His Word will be with us until the end of time. May we trust in that word of hope, peace and love. May we come to know that our God will not leave us abandoned and may we be prepared to be welcomed into God's Kingdom by being, and remaining, God's good and faithful servants.

November Sandwich Making for Capuchin Mobile Ministries



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

Today's first reading and gospel speak of the "end times", a popular topic among theologians. When I was in the "home stretch" of my Candidacy (back in 2021), the period of preparation before one offers their "Profession", or life-long commitment, to the Secular Franciscan Order (OFS), it felt (in a good way) like the "end was near"! Unlike the "end times" alluded to in today's Gospel (Mark 13:24-32), however, this Profession wasn't an ending but a beginning. If one thinks of it like graduation, that's the sense one would get with Profession. Graduation is often referred to a "Commencement", and rightfully so. It may be the end of something (e.g., high school, college, or graduate school) but it is also the beginning of something (i.e., a new "chapter" in one's life).

This "beginning" is what Profession in the OFS is all about. Once a candidate in formation in the Secular Franciscan Order is "Professed", they have full rights, privileges, and responsibilities in the OFS. They are able to hold office, vote on matters pertaining to the Order (especially on the level of the local fraternity to which they belong), and participate fully in the life of the (Local) Fraternity and the Order (as a body). It also comes with it responsibilities, duties which only professed members can undertake and accomplish. This does not mean the candidate stands idly by, waiting for profession, much like at the end times we are not called to "stand around". A candidate can participate in the life of the Order by taking what they learn in formation and applying it to both life in the OFS and life in their home, work, and family.

So, to sum up...Candidates work towards Profession, and this Profession leads to a fully active life in the OFS. Professed member have full rights, and responsibilities in the OFS. All members, both candidates and professed members, seek to incorporate Franciscan charisms into their everyday life, as well as life in the OFS. Ultimately, the goal is to live the "motto" of the OFS, namely "Bringing Gospel to Life and Life to Gospel".

Everyday Stewardship

The ancient Greek dramatist, Euripides, wrote, "No one can confidently say that he will still be living tomorrow." We seldom focus on that reality and often act like we are confident of a tomorrow. However, we all know names of those who died suddenly, maybe in tragedy or simply in the quiet of sleep. Calling those names to mind will probably still not force most of us to contemplate our own mortality tonight before placing our head on the pillow, but perhaps it should.

We don't need to obsess about dying or fear the unknown, but realizing the gift of today and reflecting on the possibility that it may be our last day can cause us to act differently. We might forgive more easily, argue less, and embrace one another. Rather than procrastinate, we might act now. We could become more mindful of our surroundings, see the needs in people, and reach out to those who are lost.

I write these Everyday Stewardship reflections every Sunday. You might read them in your parish bulletin, on a website, or in social media every Sunday. Just in case this is the last Sunday you ever have a chance to read these reflections, what is God calling you to do now before it's too late. If you are still here next Sunday after taking all this seriously, you might wonder at what it was to live more fully and to give of yourself more freely. Don't let a single day pass you by without truly loving others and your God. One thing you can be confident about: This day will never come again.
