

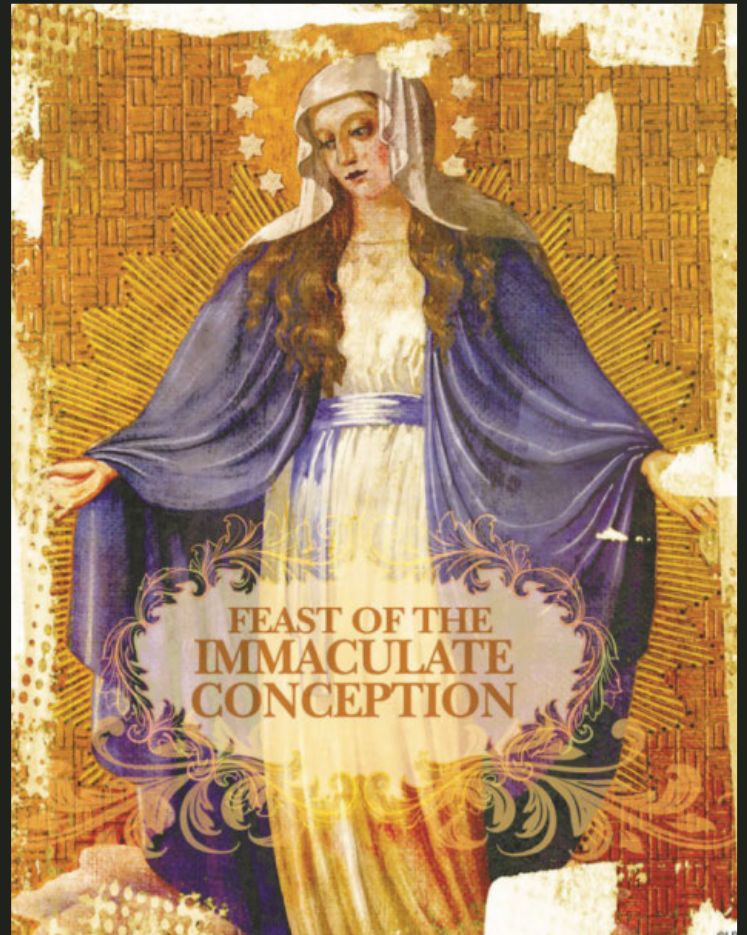
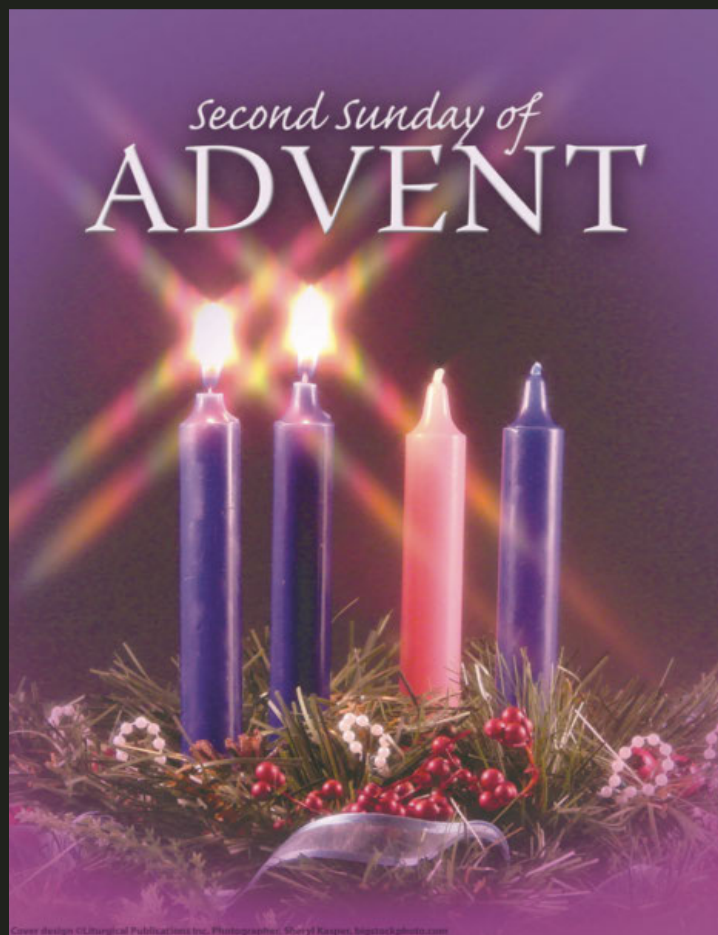

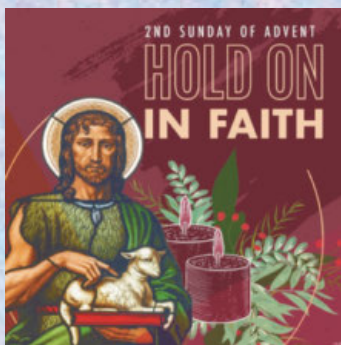

NOTES FROM THE PASTOR



My Dear Friends in Christ,

When John the Baptist came upon the scene, he was unlike anything anyone had seen before. Yes, he spoke of repentance, as other prophets had. Yes, he spoke with authority and clarity, as other prophets had. Unlike other prophets, however, his arrival was heralded by those before him. No other prophet could lay claim to this.

When Isaiah spoke of John (without naming him), there was an immediacy to the proclamation that had never been heard of before. This is why many thought that John was “THE ONE”. By his unusual nature (wearing camel hair in the desert, feeding on locusts and wild honey), many people thought that John was the Messiah. They thought that these characteristics were surely the “hallmarks” of the Promised One of God. After all, no prophet had been spoken of before his arrival, and certainly no other prophet spoke with the level of authority with which John spoke.

Luke, however, in today’s gospel puts that notion to rest. Speaking of “a voice of one crying out in the desert: Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths” (Lk 3:4, by way of Isaiah 40:3-5) Luke was obviously alluding to someone else *other than John*...and this, I’m sure, is perfectly fine with John. He knew he was just a messenger, and not The Message. John knew that his job was to lay the groundwork for one who is coming, one far greater than he.

John the Baptist’s “job” was to prepare the world for the coming of the Messiah; this is our job as well. As Catholic-Christians, we are called to let the world know that not only is the Messiah coming, but that He is already here. This is the great mystery of the Incarnation, which we will celebrate in a few short weeks. Jesus, who is to come to us as the “babe in the manger”, is already in our midst. Yes, we celebrate Christmas as the promise of God fulfilled, the “Word made flesh”. We cannot forget, however, that Jesus is in our midst, here and now. If we walk through the Advent Season thinking that we’re doing so alone, we are sadly mistaken. Our “walk of faith” towards the Kingdom can only be realized if we come to recognize the presence of Jesus in our world here and now. It is this “two-fold coming” (the coming of the Christ Child and the coming of the King of Glory) that we celebrate each and every time we gather as a family of faith, a community of believers.

May we come to celebrate Jesus when He comes to us at Christmas, but may we also celebrate His presence with us now. May we look to the Lord to lead us to deeper understanding of Him...and ourselves. May we use this Advent Season to deepen our relationship with the Lord, who calls us to share His presence with all whom we meet.

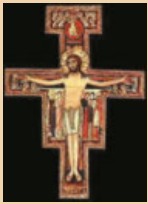

Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception – Monday December 9, 2024

This year, December 8th is the Second Sunday of Advent. As a result, the observance of the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Patronal Feast Day of the United States of America, will be transferred to Monday, December 9th.

In previous years when December 8 has fallen on a Sunday it was the practice in the United States to indicate that the obligation to attend Mass does not transfer with the liturgical observance. Currently, both the 2025 Ordo and [USCCB 2025 Liturgical Calendar](#) reflect this past practice.

Given recent clarifications on this practice from the Dicastery for Legislative Texts and the USCCB Committee on Canonical Affairs and Church Governance, we now know that the feast "must be observed as a day of obligation on the day to which it is transferred." In light of this information, the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception on Monday, December 9, 2024 is to be observed as a holy day of obligation, contrary to what was published in the Ordo and USCCB 2025 liturgical calendar before receipt of the clarification.



MY FRANCISCAN JOURNEY

In today’s gospel, our focus is on John the Baptist, the “cousin” of Jesus and the “herald” of the Messiah. At this point in the career of John, we hear how he offers a “baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins” (John 3:3). In doing this, John stands out and is seen as “a voice of one crying out in the desert” (John 3:4). The image that these phrases convey can be daunting, demanding, and (even) lonely ones. To make such a bold proclamation, to offer such a life-changing encounter, one must be sure in their mission and confident in their message. The thing with John the Baptist, like with most preachers, is that the message that he is conveying is not his. The message of the preacher is called to have God as its focus. This is true of John the Baptist, and it is true of St. Francis of Assisi.

When one looks at the life of St. Francis, one sees a man who is not lacking in confidence. He is bold in his actions and movements, especially before his conversion. As a soldier, Francis is seen as a “man of the world”. As a young man, Francis had no lack of “social” friends (I put that in quote because I wonder how many of them stuck around when he disavowed himself of his father’s riches!), and no lack of confidence. After his conversion, the hallmark of Francis’ life was humility. This humility, however, was coupled with a boldness when it came to embracing things antithetical to the world, and contrary to his former way of life. He took on “Lady Poverty” as a companion in the same way he took on those around him as companions. His acceptance of this new way of living, being one with the leprous and the poor, was as bold as when he took on the life of a soldier.

John the Baptist was used by God to further His mission, the building up of the Kingdom of God. In much the same way, Francis was used by God to further that same mission. Francis was called to walk with the poor in a particular way. Francis saw the poor as “living stones”, with which he could build up the Body of Christ and the Church. Francis saw Christ in the poor, and strove to be Christ for them. In recognizing Christ in all things, Francis was often (like John the Baptist) a “voice of one crying out in the desert”. John the Baptist’s cry was to “make straight the path” for Christ; in serving the poor and in seeing God in all created things, Francis’ was called to “rebuild” the Church. May we have the courage of men like John the Baptist and Francis of Assisi. May we attune our minds, hearts, and lives to who God is calling us to be. May we know His voice, even if it means being a “voice of one crying out in the desert”, knowing that we are never alone and that God is always with us.
