Dear Friends
On August 14 I completed my seventh year as your pastor. I have two observations: one, that

was a quick seven years and two, how grateful I am for the time we have been able to be together in the Lord's service. You have not only welcomed me but you have welcomed my family, many times. My parents, brother and nieces love to come here and have done so many times.

During these past seven years, you have also welcomed priests from Africa and India and you have had a profound effect on the lives of these priests. They are better able to serve their people because of your generosity. We may miss a word or two once in a while but we gain so much more by their witness to the gospel. Because of your generosity, you even made it possible for Fr. Christopher Adombila, upon his death, to be returned home to Ghana for a proper Catholic burial. Now it is Fr. Kani's turn to experience your kindness and generosity and I know that he is very grateful for all that you have done for him thus far. These past seven years have seen a tremendous expansion of ministry to our children and young adults and our music program. Our CCD program is second to none, and so are the many additional programs offered to our children such as the Vacation Bible School. The Peer Ministry Program offered to our high school students, as well as, their five day leadership retreat is one of the few such programs in the Archdiocese of Boston. The repairs we have made to our church and

rectory are too numerous to mention here but we have done the best we could with the money that we have been able to raise. Much of the work has been done by parishioners. As we speak, Mike McLaughlin is installing new windows in the parish hall.

I want to give special recognition to my dear friends, the Bessettes. Seven years ago I hired Dorrie and Rollie to run our music program. Some time ago, they handed the leadership part of the music program off to Paul Hoffman who has been a terrific Director of Music. Now, the Bessettes have need to put some free time in their lives so that they can continue to work full time at their regular jobs and to care for Dories' mom who lives with them, as well as, taking care of her two grandchildren on a regular basis. In your name and in my own name I extend a heart- felt thanks to Dorrie and Rollie and Heidi and Jill and to all their musical friends who have inspired us with their music over the past seven years.

This could become a very long letter as there is much to say about the past seven years. But let the word "thanks" suffice for now and know that it comes from a very grateful heart.
