DEACONS' CORNER

I had stated in my last deacons' corner that I would be writing about the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. I ended with the priest, deacon and other liturgical ministers proceeding to their seats. When our celebrant arrives at his chair, he begins with the sign of the cross followed by his greeting. He then invites us to examine our consciences and leads us in the "Confiteor" during which we all confess to Almighty God and to one another that we have sinned and ask for God's mercy and forgiveness. We follow our admission by boldly glorifying God in the highest, worshipping and giving Him thanks. Father then prays the Opening prayer, the Collect, which collects the theme of the Scripture reading of the day. We then move into the Liturgy of the Word. Because of the economy of space I will write specifically about The Scripture reading in my next Deacons' corner. As far as when to sit, stand and kneel. A general rule of thumb - when the priest sits, we sit; when the priest stands, we stand. From the Holy, Holy, Holy to after elevation of the chalice and paten with the consecrated host when he says, "Through Him, with Him and in Him in the unity of the Holy Spirit etc., we

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity, more commonly known as Trinity Sunday. It is a feast which has its roots



in the early church and was very much a response to the Arian heresy which spread around the mid-fourth century. Arius, a Christian presbyter in Alexandria, held that the Son was subordinate to the Father and Spirit in the Trinity, that He held a lower place. This heresy, along with Arius himself, was condemned in both the Council of Nicaea (325) and Constantinople (381). It was at these Councils that the Niceno-Constantinopolian Creed, as we say it today, was created and promulgated throughout the Church.

One might understand Arius' confusion, for the concept of the Trinity is a difficult one to fathom. I believe that the key to Trinity isn't so much "understanding" as it is "faithfulness". While one might seek to "figure out" what the Trinity is all about, one might be better served trying to "enter into" the Trinity. If one can strive to "live" the Trinity, one might come to"knowledge" of it. If one can look at the creative aspects of the Father, the redemptive aspects of the Son and the sanctifying aspects of the Spirit, then one can be better serve by, and better serve, the Trinity.

The key to understanding the Trinity comes in how we live our lives of faith. There are times when we rely upon, when we call upon, the different "persons" of the Trinity. These aspects of God are made all the more powerful when we realize that when we ask for the revelation of the Father, the friendship of the Son or the gifts of the Spirit, we are not abandoning the other "persons". There is only One God, no matter upon whom we call for aid and assistance. This is a key element of the Trinity, one which was missed by Arius. In "demoting" the Son to second-class status below the Father and Spirit, Arius was (perhaps inadvertently) limiting God. God is always at work – in our lives, in the lives of the Church and in the world. God is always creating, redeeming and sanctifying.

May we, as we move from the Easter Season into Ordinary Time, come to see the movement of God as ONE, just as God is ONE. May we know that whomever it is we call upon for intercession, assistance, guidance or aid, that God is always with us, at all times and in all seasons. May we help others to know this truth and may we share it with all whom we meet.

My thanks for a job well done, ladies!! - Fr. Paul Why don't Catholics add the "For yours is the Kingdom..." prayer at the end of the Our Father like the Protestants do? Where did it come from?

The conclusion of the Lord's Prayer that you refer to is called a doxology, which is a prayer of glory and praise. This particular doxology we do use in the Mass. After the Our Father, the priest prays the prayer that begins, "Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil..." and the people respond with the doxology. The doxology is not found in the Bible, in either Matthew 6:9-13 or Luke 11: 2-4, but it is very ancient. It was first found in "The Didache," also called "The Teaching of the Twelve Apostles," which dates probably from about the year AD 90. It was a letter of instruction to early converts to Christianity. Protestantism dates only to the sixteenth century, so the doxology is actually a Catholic prayer. Some scholars and the catechism (§ 2760) indicate that the doxology was not used apart from it.

Remember, both the Lord's Prayer and the Eucharist were part of the "mysteries of faith," things taught only to believers. Ironically, a remnant of a prayer used during the celebration of the Eucharist has comes to be used widely by many Christian churches that do not celebrate the Eucharist! Truth is indeed stranger than fiction!


We have ten free sample copies for the Month of June. If our test families see value in this resource we will begin this program in September.

The Increased Offertory Campaign:

Next weekend is Commitment Weekend for the Increased Offertory Campaign. Please pray about your level of commitment and come prepared to make your decision next weekend. Volunteer Advocates have been busy calling each household to ensure each parishioner has an opportunity to ask questions and be fully informed about our plans. Please contact the office if you would like to discuss the project with someone.

Our current weekly offertory is \$5,000 approx. In response to the Increased Offertory Campaign, our goal is to increase this to \$6,000 approx.

The commitments secured during the Increased Offertory Campaign, and sustained for years to come, will be directed towards specific needs that have been identified at the parish. They include:

- Assist our Parish in meeting their regular operating expenses. As many personal homes have experienced over the past few years, the parish is also experiencing increased rates in many of our monthly bills heat, electricity, insurance costs, trash removal, printing costs, IT, and updating of old hardware and software
- The lighting above our choir loft needs to be replaced, but before we can do that, the electrical work needs to be updated and the fixtures must be replaced to bring everything up to building codes.
- Our list of repairs that needs to be addressed at the church and rectory are growing each year window replacements, church & steeple painting, repairs to broken pews, and re-lining of the parish parking lot are some of the items that are on the top of our list.
