Congratulations to the Catholic Women's Club and the Fund-raising Committee for a very successful Yard Sale last Saturday. A special thank you to Kerry Fabroski and Charlene & John Tibbetts for the hard work they put in organizing, fetching, setting up and breaking down all the tables of goodies. It would not have been a success without them.

We are so close — \$586 away from meeting our goal of the Catholic appeal. If we meet or exceed this goal, by June 30th we retain 60% of the overage for our parish.

The Rectory will be closed on Monday, July 4th for the holiday.

Catholic Appeal Update

Our Catholic Appeal as off 4/12 we have made 160% of our In-Pew Goal (142 in-pew donors out of a goal of 80); this means if we make our overall goal, we will get a 5% bonus (if we meet the \$ total goal). We are well on our way to making the overall goal, as of today 6/21, we are at 98% of the target (\$25,940/\$26,526). Only \$586 to go.

What's happening in the Collaborative?

Fr. Paul will be in residence at St. John's Rectory and Fr. Mike will be in residence at St. Ann's Rectory offering the presence of a priest in both locations.

The Mass schedule will remain the same. Fr. Paul will continue to be available Wednesday through Sunday and Fr. Mike will be taking Wednesday and Thursday For his days to rest and reflect.

We hope that you will stop by whenever you need us. We are only an additional 5 minutes away.



My Dear Friends in Christ,

As you read this column, we are in the midst of another "holiday weekend". On the 4th of July, when celebrating the gift of freedom, I thank God for the gift of religious freedom. I thank God that I live

in a country where I can exercise my "freedom of religion" by publicly praying to our God for all of the good things that God has provided me over this last half century of life.

Among the things which God has provided to me is an opportunity to serve His people in my priestly ministry. Over the last 21 years, God has given me the chance to respond to the call which He placed on my heart many, many years ago. While it took me a while to respond to that initial call (placed on my heart when I was in high school, responded to (finally) after college), these last twenty-one years have been amazing in all of the various ways God has opened up to me to bring souls to Christ by preaching, teaching and serving. In my preaching, God has given me the opportunity to enflame people's hearts with "a word that will rouse them". In teaching, God has given me the chance to educate God's people about the truths of our Faith. In serving, God has placed in me a "servant's heart", putting me at the disposal of others, assisting them in ways that bring them closer to God.

The challenges to our religious freedom are there, as well. Now, more than ever, the ability to bring our faith into the "public square" is under attack. We are told that "religion is best kept for worship services" and that "it might be best if we didn't bring God into this (situation)". So, America, how's that working for you? Are we better off now that we cannot pray in school? Are we better off now that we have put God in a "box", like He is an article of clothing that we pull out only when necessary and when it is "convenient" (to all). I don't think so. There is a growing attitude that "freedom of religion" means "freedom from religion". I do not believe that this is what the founders of our great nation intended.

May we have the courage to live out our lives of faith "in season or out of season, whether convenient or inconvenient" (1 Tim 4:2). May we know that it is our God that calls us to live our lives in union with Him. May we cherish this union by living out our belief that we are sent by God to be His heralds. May our great land know the gift of God's love. May God bless our Parish, may God bless our Church, and may God bless the United States of America.
