

MESSAGE FROM FR. STEPHEN

Beloved parishioners of St. John and St. Ann,

I am Fr. Stephen Lusiba, a diocesan priest in Uganda Africa. Fr. Paul L. Ring is a great friend of mine since 2008 and I have visited him and his parishioners since then. His parish (St. John and St. Ann) is my home away from home. I am happy to be back this summer until September 12th.

While I am here, I help where need be to celebrate mass. At the same time, I share with you my mission back in Uganda and then put my appeal to you for generous help. Last year with the funds you gave our school, I St. Benedict High School in Uganda, we were able to begin the second floor of the girls' dormitory as you can see in the pictures on the board. It's not yet done. I am appealing to your generosity to raise \$25,000.00 to complete it.

The challenge is that our students walk long distances (between 3 to 8 miles) and risk great dangers to come to school. We have no buses. They arrive tired. We would like to have them in a dormitory so that they can reside at school and only go back home during holidays. If a dormitory is built, they'll be able to concentrate on education and be safe.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

As the story is told, a Baptist minister passes away and enters into the Kingdom. As he's being shown around, St. Peter is showing him the different "rooms" in Heaven. As they pass one room, the minister is informed that this is the "Baptist room"; as they go down the hall, the minister is shown the "Lutheran hall", the "Methodist hall", etc. As they pass by one room, St. Peter asks the minister to be quiet; when the minister asks why, St. Peter informs him that "this is the Catholic room – they think that they're the only ones up here!" I tell that story not to disparage the Catholic faith, but to illustrate a point.

I've always felt, as the song goes, that "there's wideness in God's mercy". Today's gospel reminds us that it takes more than "lip service" to be a Christian. It further reminds us that we might be surprised both who's *in* the Kingdom and who's *not*. We must not only *know about* God, we must *know* God. This comes from prayer, study and relationship. Our prayer draws us closer to God; our study helps us to understand our faith; our relationship with God helps us grow closer in relationship to one another.

There is no doubt that to enter into the Kingdom means entering through the "narrow gate" (Lk 13:24). This idea applies not only to our life after this world, but also our life in this world. To be a Christian means to enter into a focused way of living, sometimes shutting out or disposing of those things that are not of God. It could be a wrong attitude, an incorrect way of living or a bad relationship. In each of these cases, we must decide what matters most to us. Ultimately, we stand before the judgment seat of Christ answering for our life's decisions. At that time, it won't matter how many times we have uttered the Lord's name – all that will matter is whether we put the Lord first, above all things. God's mercy is, indeed, wide, but narrow is the way to the Kingdom. Let us prepare right here and now for that time, so that God may welcome us into His Kingdom of Love.
