DEACONS' CORNER By Deacon Joe

This week I will start my article with a quote from St. Faustina's Diary (1160). "When once I asked the Lord Jesus how He could tolerate so many sins and crimes and not punish them, the Lord answered me. 'I have eternity for punishing [these], and so I am prolonging the time of mercy for the sake of [sinners]. But woe to them if they do not recognize this time of my visitation. My daughter, secretary of My mercy, your duty is not only to write about and proclaim My mercy, but also to beg for this grace for them, so that they too may glorify My mercy'. I have been asked by some individuals lately why evil is in this world and seems to prosper. I have shared that God gave us freewill out of love for all of us and some choose to abuse this gift and live a life not in conformance with God's desire for us. We can see from St. Faustina's Diary that our God is a patient God and wishes to give us as much time as we need to follow him. Obviously the sooner we choose to live our lives with right judgement the better. In the meantime, we are all called to pray for God's great gift of mercy for those that are in need of this grace. I think it is safe to say that we all could use this great gift of mercy. Know that God loves each of us. Let us draw nearer to God's mercy each day.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

"Who is Jesus?" is, at once, a simple yet complex question. It is simple in the fact that we read about Jesus, we read His words and know His deeds. In all of this, we know of Him. The complexity of the question comes in moments such as the ones we see in today's gospel. When Jesus asks His disciples about Himself, Jesus isn't taking a poll, or gathering information. Jesus, in posing the questions that He does, wants to know if the people get it. Jesus wants to know if His disciples (and the people) understand His message, His mission and Him.

The second question posed in today's gospel ("who do you say that I am?" (Mt 16:15)) is one which we must answer for ourselves. The answer which is given will, most likely, depend on where we are on our journey of faith. It is an answer which is ours and ours alone. There may be many people with the same answer, but it is still unique to us. We are on different points, each one of us, on the road to the Kingdom. We are unique in that our lives of faith center on our own personal relationship with God. The answer which we give to the question may also vary depending on our age, gender or state of life; this is what makes the answer unique.

Peter answers the question posed to Jesus in a very astute way. Peter recognizes Jesus for who He is – The Christ. He recognizes Jesus as the Son of God, the one who's coming the prophets foretold. Peter speaks first (as he so often does!) and does so with conviction. It is for this reason that Jesus gives him the "charge" that He does - that of the "keys to the Kingdom". In this moment, Peter is put in charge of the Church from its beginnings. It is at this moment that Peter is also given the power to "bind and loose", which is the origin of what we would come to know as the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

For each one of us, the questions posed today will have vast and varied answers, and this is a good thing. It shows the diversity of the Church. The answers which we give will also have a unity, in that the all should point to the Christ, the Son of the Living God. It is Peter's statement which "sets in motion" the movements of the early Church. It is up to us to continue this momentum, and to recognize that in our answers we give life and hope to the future of the Church. May we have the courage to answer the questions posed today with courage and conviction. May we not just *know of* Jesus, but may we *know* Jesus for who He is – Lord and Savior of the world.

THE CRUCIFIX VS. THE RISEN CHRIST

In the upcoming weeks, you will see a crucifix in Saint Ann's church because the rubrics require that we have a crucifix displayed at Mass. A resurrected Jesus should only be used as general decor provided that it does not supplant nor overshadow the crucifix (which ours did). Number 308 of the General Instructions of the Roman Missal states "there is also to be a cross with the figure of Christ crucified on it, visible not only during Mass but at all times recalling for the faithful the saving passion of the Lord and remaining near the altar even outside of liturgical celebrations.

The focal point of our faith is that Jesus died on the cross to redeem humanity. Thus, at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, it is only fitting to have a crucifix prominently displayed.





Registration fees are \$150 for one child; \$200 for two children and \$250 for 3 or more children in a family.

There is an additional fee for the sacramental program years: (2nd grade - 1st Communion & Reconciliation - \$50)

Confirmation program -(9th grade - \$75) & (10th grade - \$50)

Grades 1 - 6 (Tue, Wed, Thu, 4:30-5:30 and Sat. mornings 9:00 - 10:00).

Grade 7 & 8 will meet either Wed from 6:00 to 7:00 or **Thu from** 7:00 to 8:00.

Grades 9 and Grade 10 will meet on Monday evenings. Grade 9 will be from 6:00-7:00 and Grade 10 will be from 7:00-8:00. We will have a special meeting for parents and students on September 25th at 6:00pm to explain the program and requirements.
