DEACON'S CORNER BY DEACON BRENDAN

For my final comments on the rosary, I am reminded as Catholics, we have been encouraged to make the Rosary a frequent form of prayer. Our Lady Herself has urged us in her apparitions to pray for peace and the souls in purgatory. There have been many saints over time who have urged us to pray the Rosary. Padre Pio, now Saint Pio urged us “to always recite the rosary and recite it as often as possible”. Father Patrick Payton, a Holy Cross Father from Stonehill gave talks all over the World. He would say “The family that prays together, stays together”. A Plenary indulgence may be gained under the usual condition when the Rosary is prayed in Church, in a family group or in a religious community. Three other conditions must be fulfilled: A sacramental confession, Eucharistic Communion, Prayers for the Pope's intention. In addition, one must be free of all attachments to sin, even venial sin. If these conditions are not fulfilled, the indulgence is only partial. Both a plenary and partial indulgence may be applied to the dead.

My Dear Friends in Christ,

“Render unto Caesar what is Caesar’s, and render unto God what is God’s” (Mt 22:21). You have no doubt heard the saying given by Jesus in today’s gospel (I chose to use a slightly “older” translation), but you may still be wondering what is Caesar’s and what is God’s? In answering that question, one decides how much of their life they “owe” to God and how much they “owe” to the State. The challenge comes in making that division. Most of us have to work, most have to pay taxes and most “owe” something to provide for the “common good” (roads, schools, hospitals and the like). Beyond that, one might wonder how much is to be given to that “common good”.

You’ve doubtless heard me ask the question, “do you own your wealth, or does it own you?” (taken from a financial seminar recently viewed on public television). It is a valid question, and one which Scripture poses in a different manner: “where your heart is, there your treasure will be also” (Mt 6:21). It is a valid question, for it very well directs and guides our motives and motivations. If we live “in the world, but not of the world” (another expression you’ve heard me utter, ad nauseam), then I believe we have our spiritual “house” in order. When we have our eyes focused on the mission, message, and life of Jesus and if we keep our intentions focused on making it to the Kingdom, then I believe that we’ll be just fine.

As Shakespeare says, though, “therein lies the rub” (*Hamlet*, Act 3, Scene 1)! We have to live in the world, all the while keeping our eyes focused on the Kingdom. This can be difficult, what with all of the world’s allurements and illusions. Living in the world can be that “double-edged sword” of having to enjoy the goodness of life while trying to avoid the things which aren’t good for us, good for our soul. We must realize that every decision/choice we make has consequences, and that these consequences can be life-altering (oftentimes for the better, but sometimes not!). The “Serenity Prayer” (written by Reinhold Niebuhr, used in many 12-step programs) asks for the “serenity to accept the things I cannot change, courage to change the things I can, and wisdom to know the difference. May we have these gifts so as to align ourselves with God’s will, striving to do the same each and every day.

GRAND ANNUAL IN-PEW PLEDGE CAMPAIGN TO TAKE PLACE THE WEEKEND OF NOVEMBER 4TH & 5TH

My Dear Friends in Christ,

There is an old story about a pastor who needs to raise money for a new roof. He tells his congregation that, "I have bad news, good news, and bad news". "The bad news", he says, "is that we need a new roof." "The good news", he continues, "is that we have all the money we need". "The bad news", he concludes, "is that it's in your pockets". A little humor to convey an important truth about stewardship and sacrificial giving.

It is in this spirit that I come to you to ask for your help in this year's Grand Annual Collection. This collection is vital to the fiscal health of St. John's Parish, as there is really no significant fundraising income. This year I, along with our Parish Finance Council and Jackie Buccigross (our Finance and Operations Manager), have set a goal of \$32,000. Last year we raised over \$31,000 (which was down from last year, but this is a new year!), so I am confident that, through the hard work of every family here at St. John's, and a contribution of \$250 per family, we can reach this goal. I am painfully aware of the condition of our present economy. In asking for this offering, I do so fully cognizant that not everyone can fulfill this request I make of you. I believe, however, that you will do what you can, to the degree you can, to help us make this goal. My confidence in coming to you with this request isn't just some "pie in the sky wish"; it is based on the historical generosity which you have exhibited in recent past history, evidenced in the increased giving to the Grand Annual over the last three years.

You can make your donation in either one payment or over several weeks. You may use one of the envelopes found at the usher's table (in the church). You also have the option of an "online" donation; simply consult the user's guide found on the parish website (www.stjohneb.org) or call Debbie at the Parish Office and she will walk you through the process. The money collected from the Grand Annual Collection will be used to keep the budget in balance and if possible for some improvements to the physical plant. One "dream project", for but one example, is painting the exterior of our church which serves as a beacon of hope for so many in our community!

As you prayerfully consider making this "free-will offering", as I like to call it, let us all remember that St. John's is our "second home", a place of peace and refuge from a world of challenge and chaos. We have over 1200 people who worship with us, who come to St. John's to find "food for the journey" in both Word and Sacrament. We have a vibrant Religious Education program, a faith-filled Vacation Bible School, and a lively Parish and Family Ministry (with a variety of programs offered each month!), leading our people - of all ages - to a deepened faith. We have a dedicated staff and corps of volunteers who keep us moving forward towards the Kingdom. From our Religious Education Catechists, to St. Vincent de Paul Volunteers, to the Catholic Women's Club of East Bridgewater, to our Parish and Youth Ministry Leadership Teams, to our Sacramental Ministers, we have people of every generation assisting us in this endeavor. It is in this spirit that I ask for your contribution to our Grand Annual Collection. Please be assured of my prayers for you and yours as you continue to worship, walk and pray with us, now and into the future. Asking God's continued blessings I am, and remain
