My Dear Friends in Christ,

"Where your treasure is, there also will your heart be" (Lk. 12:34); "For at an hour you do not expect, the Son of Man will come" (Lk. 12:40). These words of Jesus serve as a reminder to us to keep our focus and to remember what is lasting, what is truly important. It does not mean that we forsake our duties and responsibilities in this life, but that we can never forget our purpose in being here. Everything we do, say and are is meant to help our brothers and sisters (and ourselves) to know God's love, to build up the Kingdom of God and for the greater glory of God.

In bringing these truths to His disciples (and to us), Jesus reminds them (and us) anyone who has knowledge of God has a responsibility to espouse and teach (in word and in deed) these tenets. There is no "off-season" for the Christian; there is no "down time" for a follower of Jesus Christ. The vigilance we show in our daily lives towards these truths is a reflection of the love Jesus has for us. We are merely returning that which has been given to us in and through the person of Jesus Christ. In living our lives in accord with the teachings of Christ, we are showing our fidelity to the truth that is found in Him. So, how do we do this? First off we acknowledge that it is not us doing the work; it is God, working in and through us, who in charge. This is what faith, the faith about which Paul speaks in our second reading, is all about. It was in and through faith that Abraham was able to do great things, for he trusted in God's plan for him. God has a plan for us as well. We cannot always see that plan, yet we trust that it is there in some form - this is faith. It has been realized in Christ Jesus, He who came into the world to bring life. life eternal.

Let us have faith that God is working through us, just as he worked through those men and women of our faith tradition. Let us know, through this same faith, that God continues this work until that great day of salvation when He will call us home to Himself. Let us be ever vigilant as we await our Master's arrival, so that when He comes He may find us eager to serve, not only here but in the Kingdom.
