My Dear Friends in Christ,

"Ignorance", it was once written, "is the mother of presumption." This quote, attributed to Marie de Gournay (a 16th century author), could be used to summarize today's gospel from Luke. Jesus reminds the listener that we are to "strive to enter through the narrow gate" (Lk. 13:24). We are to do this because not all will be saved, and we can never presume upon the saving power of God. We can ask for it, we can pray for it, we can even beg for it. The only way that God's grace and saving power will come upon us is if God, in His infinite wisdom and love, bestows it upon us. There will be many who will call upon the Lord, claiming a relationship with Him. Many of them will be turned away because association with Jesus is not enough; it takes a relationship with Jesus - not only us acknowledging Him, but He acknowledging us.

I've often said that we might be surprised as to who we see in Heaven. There might be men and women throughout salvation history who might be "locks" when it comes to citizenship in Heaven (Mother Theresa and Pope John Paul II come to mind). The thing we have to remember about these people is that they never presumed God's mercy – they worked for it. I'm not saying that we can "earn" Heaven (for it is a free gift from God won through the death and resurrection of Jesus). But in seeking that narrow way that leads to Jesus, there is work to be done, the work of the Christian life. It is a work of service, of sacrifice and of love. It is one in which the person puts their needs second, one in which the person "dies to self" so that Christ might live in them.

Let us have the courage to seek the Lord in every aspect of our lives. Let us trust in the goodness of God to see us through difficult moments. Let us "know" that the Lord is at work in our lives by bringing Christ to all whom we meet. Let us strive for the Kingdom, seeking that narrow way that leads to Christ, to salvation and to Eternal Life.
