There is so much to do and so little time left--just a little over a week. Throw in a recession, a little unemployment, some illness and maybe some family problems and some may be more inclined to skip the entire Christmas Holiday. I think that if we are honest with ourselves, everyone has felt that way from time to time. However, if you do feel that way, I would suggest that you need Christmas more than those who have an easier time singing "Joy to the World."

The birth of Christ is a reminder to us all that the Father sent his only Son, not to make us smile and be happy but to show us the Way-the Truth and the Light so that we can make our way through the Calvaries of our lives. In Heaven we can be happy and smile but on earth we need to trust that the Truth of the gospel will set us free from all the lies that our world would set before us.
