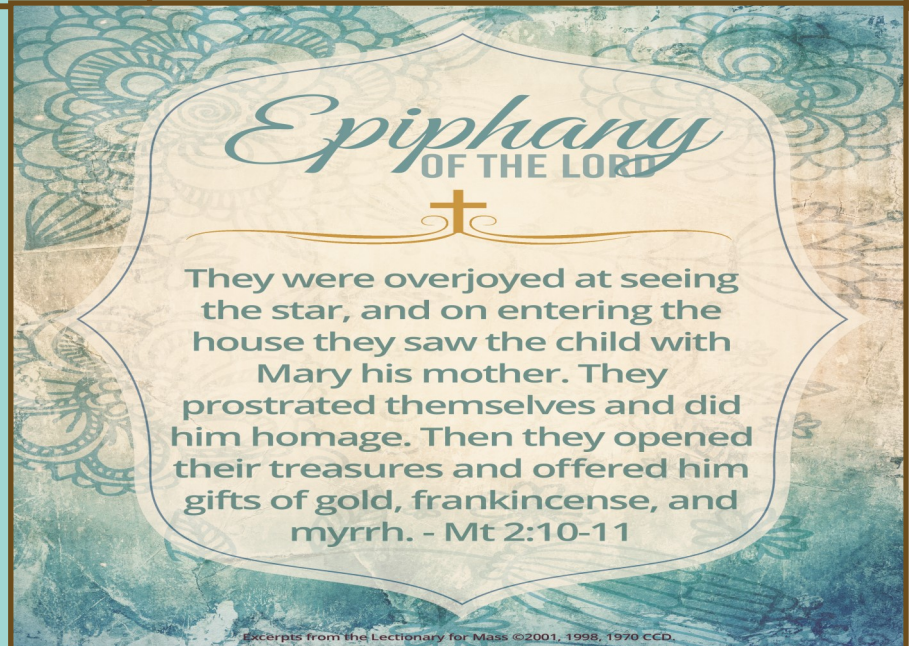

## A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Today our Church celebrates the Feast of Epiphany. Growing up, I always understood this to be the "end of the Christmas Season".

This makes sense for many reasons:

it speaks of God's manifestation to humanity in Christ, it highlights the appearance of the Magi, and it is a bit of a "birthday party" for Jesus. How wrong I was! The Christmas Season actually/officially ends with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord (which, by a "quirk" in the calendar, is tomorrow!). This makes infinitely more sense! After all, our entrance into the Church isn't marked by our birth but by our baptism. The Baptism of Jesus, about which we will read at tomorrow's liturgy, begins Jesus' entrance into "public" ministry. It is His "coming out party" as it were.

Now back to today's feast. The Feast of the Epiphany, a word which has its roots in the Greek word "epiphaneia", which means "manifestation", marks and celebrates the appearance of the Magi upon the scene of Jesus' birth in Bethlehem. In the classic Greek it was used to mark the appearance of gods. Of course, in our monotheistic tradition, this is adapted to mark the appearance of the One True God in the Person of Jesus Christ. The first reference in Christian literature to the Epiphany would be in the 4<sup>th</sup> century, which speaks of Jesus' "birth, that is, His Epiphany" by St. Epiphanius of Salamis in his work "Panarion" (written in 361). It was celebrated on January 6<sup>th</sup> for the longest time, and currently is celebrated on the Sunday between January 2<sup>nd</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> (thus the short "down time" this year between Christmas and Epiphany).

I can always remember the Feast of the Epiphany for the traditions we held in our household. We would set up the crèche on Christmas Eve (minus the Baby Jesus, of course!), placing Baby Jesus in the manger when we returned home from Midnight Mass. On Christmas Day, the Magi would make their appearance, but not at the manger – they would be placed on the kitchen counter! Over the next week or so, they would slowly be moved from the counter, to the stovetop, to the back of the couch and finally into the manger scene. This, of course, gave each of the five children a chance to "relocate" the Magi. The Magi were three in number (as in the song "We Three Kings"?); this, we later came to find out, was probably not entirely accurate. We came to find, through investigation, that there were as many as a dozen "magi", which is, not coincidentally, related to our modern word, "magic". The Magi were a class of palace workers who were part magician, part alchemist, part astrologer (thus their knowledge of, and reliance on, stars for guidance). They were "jacks of all trade" (although "jacks" may be a bit of a misnomer, as there may have been some women in their company), relied on by the king (such as Herod) for guidance and direction for many things.

The Feast of the Epiphany gives us an opportunity for a "breather" (albeit a small one this year!) between Christmas and the Baptism of the Lord. May we, like the Magi, come to the manger and reflect on the good things God has provided for us – namely, Christ the Lord.

## A Call to Action for our Parishes

Fr. Paul, the Committee and I are enjoying this weekly opportunity to highlight the programs going on in the Parish and Youth Ministry. Some of the feedback we are receiving is that there may still be the misunderstanding that this is only a Youth Ministry Program. As featured below this article, you will see that we have programs for all ages. A New Year brings new hope, a renewed faith, and excitement for what may come and we hope is that more Parishioners will take part in our programs from both St. Ann and St. John.



Something else you may not be aware of is how these programs, events, retreats and service projects are funded. The Parish and Youth Ministry is completely self-funded and neither St. Ann or St. John's budgets fund the programs. Our Ministry is dependent on our (2) second collections and our fundraisers. This year we have decided to focus on two major fundraisers in the hopes of funding our financial needs. The money raised funds program materials, keeps costs low so that all can afford the programs, and subsidizes the cost of the Mission Trip. In our first two years as a ministry we have been completely self-funded. The Ministry has beautiful support by way of volunteers at events, participation in our programs, and a tremendous amount of feedback that our Ministry is bringing our Faith Family together in grace, in love and in hope. If we are not able to maintain our self-funded status, it is unlikely the ministry would be able to continue.

Neither our Gold Tournament or Auction will be a success without a committee for both. Help is needed securing donations for the raffles for the auction, sponsors for the Golf Tournament, selling tickets to either function, and a team to help out at the actual events. Our hope is to have 200 attend the auction and a minimum of 125 golfers. It will take personal connections of Parishioners to make this work because many (if not all) of the large companies or sports teams will not donate directly to a Church. 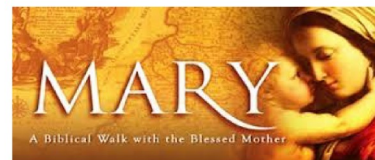

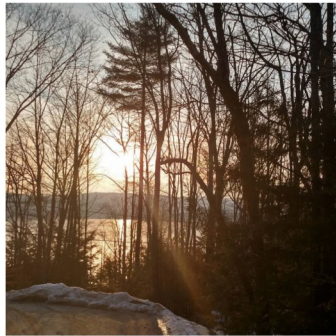

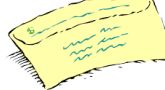
