

DEACON'S CORNER BY DEACON BRENDAN

A few thoughts on this forty-fourth Anniversary of Roe vs. Wade, the U.S. Supreme Court decision permitting a woman to seek and have an abortion. The following thoughts are from a well known Redemptorist, Father Joe Manton of Mission Church:

"It is true that the Supreme Court has made abortion legal. But no Supreme Court can ever make abortion moral. They will tell you abortion is a medical matter, or a social matter, not a religious matter. Certainly not a Catholic matter. And here how precisely right they are.

Abortion was wrong back in the days of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, long before there was ever a Catholic Church.

True the Catholic Church opposes and condemns abortion. But it also condemns larceny, bribery, perjury. These crimes are not wrong because the Catholic Church condemns them. The Catholic Church condemns them because they are wrong."



My Dear Friends in Christ,

Back in high school, I was asked by my pastor if I had ever considered a vocation to the priesthood. I can remember distinctly the reaction I had to that inquiry: I laughed in his face! There was no disrespected intended, for I was sure that he was joking; when he said that he wasn't, I was, to say the least, contrite if not downright remorseful. This encounter was then followed by two other (seemingly, at the moment) unrelated conversations. When the third conversation occurred surrounding this same topic I was, indeed, intrigued. Was God actually calling *me* to the priesthood? Did I dare say yes? When I did, eventually, say yes, my whole world changed. I realized that God was, indeed, calling me to become a "fisher of men" (Mk 1:17).

In today's gospel, the response of the first followers of Jesus was far more immediate and sure. They left everything they had and followed Jesus, which must have taken extraordinary faith and courage. To leave everything you know, everything that holds you secure is an amazing "leap of faith". This is what God is calling us to do, to respond to our baptismal call by following Him. Yes, it does take an I incredible amount of faith to do this, but when we do the results can be life-changing. We may not be called to leave everything we know, but that's not really the point of today's gospel. In its wider context, the gospel passage today is calling us to look within our own circles of friends, our own families, to see who needs to be "reeled in". There are many of our own who are "adrift" who are looking for "safe harbor", and we can be the one who brings them "safely to shore".

We can't be sure of what was going through the minds of those first disciples, but we know that there was something alluring about Jesus' call to them. It made them give up everything they knew, everything that held them secure, to follow Him. Is God calling us to something, something beyond ourselves? Is God calling us, by virtue of our baptismal call, to be disciples, to be (in paraphrasing the gospel) "fishers of people"? It could very well be that God is calling us and, for whatever reason – it could be apathy, fear or doubt – we are not responding as fully as we could/should be. Let us have the same trust the first disciples did. Let us attune our hearts to hear the call of Jesus so that others may come to know what we have come to know: that Jesus has come into the world to follow Him, now and into the Kingdom.

Over the past several months the special collection schedule was reviewed in an effort to identify ways in which as an Archdiocese we can continue to support the wider needs of the Church but at the same tie reduce the number of collections being taken up.

With the assistance of the IFRM Review Committee, we identified an opportunity to strategically look at the collections in light of the mission of the Catholic Church and not as individual collections In doing so, we were able to group collections and reduce the number of collections from 17 to 10; collections are now grouped under a common mission category.

My fiancée and I are planning our wedding for next year. We still have to attend classes and meet with a priest. What should we expect from the classes? Does the priest test us to see if we are ready to be married?

A

For many years the church has tried to help couples prepare for marriage. The rising divorce rate, as well as the recognition of marriage as a sacrament, led to the development of Marriage Prep Dialogues and Engaged Encounter Weekends. Both programs are designed to encourage couples to discuss the basic fundamentals of relationship within the context of marriage: communication, finance, sexuality, spirituality and values and goals. Open and honest dialogue, as well as a sense of shared values, can make a big difference in a marriage. The classes are not a "how to" course, but provide information and encouragement as you discuss how you will live your married life.

The married couples in these programs often share their own experience and information as a guide and example. The priest may give some spiritual insights on how living the sacrament of marriage differs from the legal understanding of marriage. He is not there to test you, but rather to help you cover all the bases and be certain that you and your future spouse are well-informed and prepared to take on the responsibilities and commitment of marriage. The goal of marriage is union and love. Openness, honesty, trust, and love are the glue that keeps couples together for a lifetime.
