

My Dear Friends in Christ,



When one does a "Google search" on the phrase "salt and light", one comes up with over nine million entries. Listings abound, with everything from church ministries to small faith communities to t-shirts emblazoned with a salt shaker and a light bulb! All of them have one thing in common – they trace their origin back to today's gospel passage in which Jesus uses the images of salt and light to describe how we, as Christians, are to be and act in the world.

Jesus, throughout His earthly ministry, used "earthy" images. This is understandable, given that people of His day were so connected to the earth and its environs. Jesus, in using images such as this, as well as speaking in parables (stories which point to a greater truth), wanted people to strive for a higher reality, one which reaches beyond this world. One may wonder how effective these images and stories are today, since we have become somewhat "disconnected" with our environment, often seeing it merely as a place to "hang our hat" while we go through life. I think it would be a mistake for us to fall into this trap; the earth isn't just a "stopping point" for us until we get to heaven. Our earthly journey is meant as a learning experience for us so that when we do (God willing) make it to heaven we can know that we helped "build the Kingdom" in our time here. This is why we pray, in the "Our Father", "thy Kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." It is no accident that we are here on earth, which is why we are called to be "salt and light" to the world.

Salt and light are connected by their dispensation. When one uses too little salt in a meal, it can be bland and tasteless; when one uses too little light, one can stumble and fall. Conversely, when one uses too much salt, the dish being prepared can be "overwhelmed" by the spice; when one uses too much light, one can be blinded and thus rendered unable to move freely. In using both salt and light, a balance must be achieved; in the same way, in our lives of faith balance must be struck so that the message of Holy Scripture and Tradition as found in our Church can be heard, acted upon and lived. If one lives their life of faith sparingly, the message of faith might go unheard; if one is too "heavy-handed", then people are turned off and the message is similarly lost.

May we have the courage to be "salt and light" to our brothers and sisters. May we be a "light to the nations" and may we "spice up" the world when able and necessary. May we effectively preach the gospel in word and deed by sensing the needs of our brothers and sisters, responding to those needs and thus bring forth the greater glory of God.

GETTING PREPARED FOR LENT

FASTING:

Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting. Ash Wednesday (March 1,) and Good Friday (April 14) are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs; but, eating between meals is not permitted. Liquids including milk and fruit juices between meals are allowed.

ABSTINENCE:

Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday, March 1 and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be taken at all.

Pancakes with the Pastor is February 12th instead of being the third Sunday of the month due to school vacation. This will be held at St. John's from 9:00—10:00. Eggs, sausage, and pastries will be served.



The Beauty and Grace of Three



Dear Parishioners,

A year after arriving at St. John, Fr. Paul established the Family and Youth Ministry as a unique way to create programs for all ages, not just for high school students. This Ministry would focus on total parish programs, opportunities for faith formation, service, and prayer, and was charged with being self-funded by the financial team. Our Parishes are very fortunate to be led by a Pastor who faithfully lives out God's call to him to lead His sheep in faith. Fr. Paul greets each and every one of us exactly where we are on our Faith journey, and strives to create opportunities for us all to grow a stronger and more vibrant Faith family where the love of Christ is visible and powerful.

In the first two and half years, the Ministry has undergone a name change, created both an Adult and Youth Advisory Team, designed a logo, and introduced the L.O.O.P. communication tools to keep everyone informed of programs from the Parish and Youth Ministry and events and gather suggestions and ideas from the Parishes. The Parish and Youth Ministry has also expanded to be the first collaborative ministry serving both St. Ann and St. John and in doing so has become the bridge to bring parishioners together to share our resources and our gifts.

As a measurement of success for our programs the question is often asked; "How many attended?" From now on based on the shared experiences, the answer is going to be: "Three!" It is very clear time and time again, that the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are actively working within our ministry to bring our Faith Family closer together in the love of Christ.

If you have ever attended an event and looked around in the faces of those near you it doesn't take long to see that "a-ha" moment in someone's eye, that moment when the speaker, guest or musician's witness has touched someone's heart with grace and love. Often it might be in a tear quietly rolling down someone's check or a grin from ear to ear. Just a few of these powerful moments include: the indescribable peace that was felt during Adoration when Lift visited our Parish, or the many that waited to be heard in confession because those in attendance at our Parish Mission felt called to receive the grace of the sacrament. Each summer at VBS with close to 100 volunteers we witness the love and friendship that is shared between our littlest of campers starting at age 3 and their teen leader or our elementary campers and their crew leaders, or in those that have lived Cursillo and attend one of our Ultreya Group Sharing meetings where you feel the love and support that lifts you up to tackle life a little stronger until the next meeting. Perhaps you are one of the adults that feel like it's time to learn a little bit more about your faith and have been nourished not just by pancakes but by your Pastor at our Pancakes with the Pastor or with our group as we call on Mary to bring us to the feet of Jesus in the study of "Mary, A Biblical Walk." Maybe you are a parent of a child that has taken part in any one of our events and noticed they come home a little different-a little brighter because they are filled with the amazing grace of the Holy Spirit, or you have been part of one of our service teams that refurbished both the front hallway and side hallway of St. John, built kneelers for the Chapel, finished the clean-up work on the prayer garden, donated lunches to the Main Spring House, donated blankets to the hospital, or worked in the communities of Nashville.

The ministry is flourishing with so many individual moments of grace, love, and friendship, but we still need to be mindful of the charge of being a self-funded ministry in order for these moments to continue. Most businesses take three to five years to break even, and we are humbled and thankful for the financial support in our first two years to meet the self-funded mandate. With your continued financial support we have every confidence that the plan we put in place at the start of year three will deliver financial success. In an effort to keep the focus on the spiritual aspect of the Ministry and not make our Parishioners feel like the Ministry was always asking for money, last summer, we developed a new plan to create two major annual fundraisers: An Auction and a Golf Tournament.

What does a successful auction look like? It's a night when we come together to laugh, to enjoy each other, and create a shared experience as a faith family that brings us closer to the heart of Christ, just like any of our programs or events. In our joy of being together, our adult and our youth leadership teams are looking forward to working with you to also make this night a financial success that brings us closer to or exceeds our self-funded mandate. Remember we have two Parishes to help meet the goals set out by the Auction and the Golf Tournament Teams. Just as we have made our programs and events a success, we know we can reach our financial goals so that the Ministry can continue to grow into year four and beyond.

The following are the needs set forth by the Auction Adult and Youth Teams and we welcome your ideas suggestions and participation:

- A minimum of 150 donated items for our live auction, silent auction, raffles and games (including services, sports items, themed gift baskets)
- A minimum of 200-250 adults enjoying a night out that will include dinner, dancing, entertainment and the auction. If you buy a ticket and bring a
 friend we will reach our goal!
- 3-6 groups or individuals that would like to entertain our guests throughout the evening with song, dance, magic .A DJ willing to donate his/her services
