



My Dear Friends in Christ,

In writing this column, I recall a conversation I had with a seminary classmate of mine who is from Greece and has relatives who are shepherds. One of the interesting things he told me about the sheep is that when they have been with the shepherd for a long enough period of time, they become "attuned" to the voice of the shepherd. After a while they will not respond to another voice, not even another shepherd's.

This is why Jesus uses the image of the sheep and the shepherd in conveying the relationship that we are to have with Him. Jesus knows us, and He knows us intimately. We, for our part, are called to know Him, to know His voice. The only way that we can do this is by "tuning out" other voices, voices which are contrary to the Lord's. This can be a difficult, seemingly impossible thing. There are so many voices which run contrary to His that it can be hard to tell to which ones we are to listen. These "other" voices can lead us in directions which may seem, for a time, to be good places. Ultimately, however, the decisions we make and the roads we choose to walk are meant to lead us to deeper and complete relationship with and in God.

So how do we "tune out" these other voices? The first way, I believe, is to invite God into our everyday life. To make God a part of every decision, every conversation and every encounter we have with/in the world is vitally important. The next way is prayer. When we open up our mind and heart to God, God can show us amazing things! When we communicate with God, both speaking and listening, we can realize the good things God has in store for us. Finally, we need to act on that communication, practicing what we preach. In this way, we can establish, maintain and grow our relationship with God.

May we have the courage to "tune out" those voices which are not God. May we, in our decision-making and in our conversations, never be afraid to make God a part of them. May we know God, serve His people and love all who come into our midst. May we, when we hear the voice of the good shepherd (who is Christ) respond with full and open hearts. May we respond in love, willing to lay down our lives for our brothers and sisters in the same way that Jesus has laid down His life.

STOP THE ROE ACT. Say No to HB 3320 and SB1209 Oppose the Roe Act Infanticide Bill

- 3. Removes any need for a young girl to obtain any consent whatsoever before undergoing an abortion procedure;
- 4. Removes any requirement that efforts be made to save a living baby who survives the abortion procedure; and
- 5. Funds these types of abortions through the "Healthy Start" program even for women who do not qualify for MassHealth.

In 1770 Edmund Burke wrote "the only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing."
