A NOTE FROM THE PASTOR

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi). This feast celebrates the fact that we are fed by the very person of Christ. It is by His Body and Blood that we have life within us. In fact,



Jesus reminds the listener of today's gospel that "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you" (Jn 6:53). We are further reminded, by Christ Himself, that "my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink" (Jn 6:55). This is why the sixth chapter of the Gospel of John is referred to as the "Bread of Life Discourse". We are fed by the Body and Blood of Christ, and it is this "true food...and...true drink" (ibid) that make us One Body in Christ.

Something else which has made us "One Body In Christ" is our Collaborative venture. A few weeks ago we reached the milestone of ONE YEAR together as a Collaborative body! One of the ways that we have (can) "mark" this achievement is the unveiling of our "**Collaborative Name**": "**The 'Together In Christ' Collaborative**". This is a name that was drawn from parishioner input, as well as Collaborative Staff and Parish Pastoral Council deliberation. I think that it is a fine name, one that unifies the Collaborative and puts Christ at the center of all that we do as a Collaborative.

This is something of which we should be very proud. We made great strides in this first year, but to paraphrase the great New England poet, Robert Frost, we are reminded that we have "miles to go before *we* sleep". We have much work to do, including creating a Local Pastoral Plan (modeled after the Archdiocesan plan, "Disciples In Mission"), something members of both parishes, who have come together to form a Plan Writing Team, have already have been working on as "one body" (our second/next meeting is June 21st).

Another thing we have been hard at work doing is fostering an atmosphere of transparency. I know this is a "buzzword" that is used (even overused, in some cases) in the corporate world (the "real world", as my brother would call it!). Given that, it is not a word I use lightly. It is a powerful word which conveys a sense of openness, honesty, and frank discussion. In these discussions (some of which I have had, some which are yet to come) I strive to both "set the record straight" (regarding perceptions/misperceptions) and be open to listen to you as to how to "chart a course" for the best way forward. One of the ways you will see this is in the financial disclosures and reports that come forth from myself and Jackie Buccigross (our Collaborative Finance and Operations Manager), our Finance Councils (one of which St. John's has, and St. Ann's is in the process of forming (after a many-years absence from the scene)). Both St. John's and St. Ann's have a proud history of supporting the endeavors of our parishes, and I anticipate that to go on for years to come.

It is my fervent hope and prayer that in working "Together In Christ", we as a Collaborative are open to the promptings of Christ, who calls us to live as one. May we do this with a sense of openness and honesty, with an eye towards doing our best to build up the Body of Christ here in our local communities. May we look to Christ as our Head and see with His eyes, reach out with His hands, and love with His Sacred Heart.
