

DEACONS' CORNER By Deacon Brendan

The whole liturgical life of the Church revolves around the Eucharistic Sacrifice (Mass) and the sacraments. The purpose of the sacraments is to Sanctify people; to build up the Mystical Body of Christ; and finally, to give worship to God. Cc 1112. Even though each of the seven sacraments has its own identity, they all share the common purpose of nourishing us and raising the level of holiness in each one of us.

Sacramentals bear a similar resemblance to the sacraments for they too make holy through the intervention of the Church. Sacramentals prepare us to receive grace and dispose us to cooperate with the grace offered.

There are various forms of sacramentals. They are blessings of persons, meals, objects and places. Every blessing praises God and prays for His gifs. We are familiar with the blessing before meals, the blessing of rosaries and medals. We also have witnessed a blessing of readers, altar servers, Eucharistic ministers and catechists. These last blessings are not to be confused with sacramental ordinations. They usually mention the names of the persons of the Holy Trinity, use holy water and end with the sign of the cross. A few years back, there was a country song put out, popularized by Kenny Chesney, called "Everybody Wants To Go To Heaven" which says that "everybody wants to go to heaven...but nobody want to go now". It speaks to the fact that many folks want to enter into the Kingdom, but few (if anyone) want to go before they've lived all the life they feel that have coming. There's only one thing wrong with that kind of thinking – it's not up to us!

Peter speaks up in today's gospel, voicing this kind of thinking. When he pulls Jesus aside and cautions against the kind of talk Jesus is uttering, he is thinking in human terms and loses sight of the mission of Jesus – the Kingdom. Jesus rebukes Peter (rightfully so), as the mission of Jesus is to end in His death. Jesus knows this and is not afraid to face the reality of this. Jesus realizes that He must die so that we might have life – Eternal Life. This is the "end goal" of Jesus' mission here on earth, that we might see the Kingdom. This is the mission of each one of us as Catholic-Christians as well, that of the Kingdom.

The reality of the Christian life is that we must die to self so that Jesus might live in us. This is a hard reality for many, for it goes "against the grain" of the thinking in modern society. We live in a world that seeks to preserve and prolong life, which is not a bad thing, necessarily. Another issue of recent years has been the push for assisted suicide (euphemistically called "physicianassisted death"). The problem with these ways of thinking come when it gets in the way of God's plan for us and for the world. God's desire is for us to have life, life eternal in the Kingdom. This isn't possible if we strive to live forever in this present reality. We are not meant to live forever in this reality; one day, we are meant to enter into the Kingdom. As it is with Jesus, the "timeline" for this is not up to us; it is for our Heavenly Father to decide. It is God who knows "the day and the hour" of our going home to the Kingdom.

May we have the courage to give ourselves over to God's plan. May we come to know that plan in our lives and may we strive to live that plan as best as we can. May we have the strength to unite our will over to God, not relinquishing the free will God gives us but aligning it with the plan which God has for us – life eternal in the Kingdom.



THE CRUCIFIX VS. THE RISEN CHRIST

In the upcoming weeks, you will see a crucifix in Saint Ann's church because the rubrics require that we have a crucifix displayed at Mass. A resurrected Jesus should only be used as general decor provided that it does not supplant nor overshadow the crucifix (which ours did). Number 308 of the General Instructions of the Roman Missal states "there is also to be a cross with the figure of Christ crucified on it, visible not only during Mass but at all times recalling for the faithful the saving passion of the Lord and remaining near the altar even outside of liturgical celebrations.

The focal point of our faith is that Jesus died on the cross to redeem humanity. Thus, at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, it is only fitting to have a crucifix prominently displayed.




