DEACON'S CORNER By DEACON BRENDAN

Saturday, September 29th we celebrate the Feast of Saint Michael, the Archangel, Saints Gabriel and Raphael. They are God's faithful ministers. These three angels are among the seraphim who stand before the throne of God, singing praises to the Lord because of His victory over sin and death.

Michael means "Who is like God?"; Gabriel means "God's strength"; and Raphael means "God's remedy". All three angels are mentioned in Sacred scripture. May our voices join theirs in praising Our Lord and King.



FRIDAY, OCTOBER 5TH Harvey Ball, the creator of the "smiley face symbol", thought that we, all of us, should devote one day each year to smiles and kind acts throughout the world. My Dear Friends in Christ,

There is an old saying which states that "the enemy of my enemy is my



friend". It surmises that if someone is combating another who is at cross-purposes with your goals and objectives, they are "in your camp" as your ally. This can be true in the realms of government, military or even ministry. This is the point which Jesus is making in today's gospel.

As the renown of Jesus grows, the number of followers and disciples grows as well. The Twelve report back to Jesus that they saw others (not of their company) performing miraculous acts. Jesus "sets the record straight" by letting the listener know that one cannot both do the works of God and speak/act against God. If they are truly "of God", that is working, speaking and acting with the purpose of building up the Kingdom and furthering the mission of Jesus, then they cannot be wrong. There are ways to test this ministry; Jesus would later remark that "each tree is known by its own fruits" (Mt 7:20). In this way, one can determine if one is acting in the name of God or if one is working for one's own purpose and gain. It can be as simple as providing a cup of water, for the work of God is charitable love.

St. Paul speaks of this in our second reading. He speaks of the rich storing for themselves treasures. In doing so, they are not looking to build up the Kingdom – they are looking to build up their own bank account. This might give them security for now; but in the long run, it will be held in testimony against them (see Jas. 5:3). The "treasures" which we are to store up for ourselves are not things which this world can provide. They are things such as mercy, understanding, patience, peace, and love. When we secure treasures such as these, we unite ourselves to Christ and His Kingdom.

May we have the courage to prophesy in the name of God. May we pray for the knowledge and wisdom which comes from God alone, a spiritual "sight" which allows us to see things for how they are and not how they are perceived. May we come to know God's mercy for us and may we share that mercy, forgiveness and love with all whom we meet.

WASHINGTON (CNS) -- Pledging to "heal and protect with every bit of the strength God provides us," the U.S. bishops' Administrative Committee Sept. 19 outlined actions to address the abuse crisis, including approving the establishment of a third-party confidential reporting system for claims of any abuse by bishops.

It also instructed the U.S. bishops' canonical affairs committee to develop proposals for policies addressing restrictions on bishops who were removed or resigned because of allegations of abuse of minors or adults.

It initiated the process of developing a code of conduct for bishops regarding sexual misconduct with a minor or adult or "negligence in the exercise of his office related to such cases."

The committee also said it supported "a full investigation into the situation" surrounding Archbishop Theodore E. McCarrick, former cardinal-archbishop of Washington, "including his alleged assaults on minors, priests and seminarians, as well as "any responses made to those allegations."

The statement, released by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, came out of the committee's semiannual meeting held Sept. 11-12 at USCCB headquarters in Washington.
