

My Dear Friends in Christ,

Advent has arrived! It's hard to believe, but we begin another liturgical year. We begin our use of "Cycle 'A" for Sundays and "Year I" for Week-



days, for the liturgically-minded in our congregation. We also move into usage of Matthew's Gospel. Thematically, Matthew's Gospel (written, most likely, not by Matthew, but by an anonymous Jewish-Christian) revolves around the Kingdom of Heaven and Jewish elements such as Jesus' lineage to David and Jesus portrayal as "King of the Jews". These elements, while not unique to Matthew, are stressed most profoundly in Matthew's Gospel.

This "sets the stage" for us to begin our new liturgical year. As we dive headfirst into Advent, we "begin at the end", so to speak. Jesus, in today's gospel, is speaking of the end times, of what will occur as we are called home to the aforementioned Kingdom of Heaven. This is appropriate to our Advent journey, for Advent is a time of "two-fold waiting" – waiting for the Christ Child, born from the line of David, and the waiting for Jesus as the King of Glory who calls us home to fullness of life in the Kingdom (of Heaven). This waiting can be, for many, a test of faith (and patience, if you are of a certain youthful age, waiting for Christmas to arrive!). We want to go to heaven, but we also want to live life to the fullest here on earth. The thing to remember about our lives on earth is that they are but a foretaste and promise of what awaits us in the Kingdom. We can go about working (as is evidenced in today's gospel), but we should be ready, here and now, for Jesus' call to join Him for all eternity. This is the sum of the "two-fold waiting".

Our Advent journey is also a time of preparation of those "waitings". Often times, we think of Lent as the season of "preparation", with its emphasis on reconciliation, of "making straight the path". This language will appear to us next week, with the emergence of John the Baptist. Advent, like Lent, is a time for us to clear out the "spiritual deadwood", those things which are not of God. One way we can do this is by taking advantage of one of the "hidden gems" of our Church - the Sacrament of Reconciliation. When we open our hearts to God in this way, we make known to God those things of which we want to rid ourselves.

May we use the opportunities Advent presents to grow in our relationship with God and His Church. May we know God's healing love in the sacraments (of Eucharist and Reconciliation). May we always be aware of God's desire to share the gifts of faith, hope and love with us, and may we, in turn, share these gifts with all whom we meet.



EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP - RECOGNIZE GOD IN YOUR ORDINARY MOMENTS

Wide-Open Eyes

When my first child was born, we had a nursery created for him that featured images from "The Beginner's Bible" painted on all the walls. (You may have seen this Bible before, where the Biblical figures in the book all had large wide-open eyes.) Images of Adam and Eve, David and Goliath, and Jesus were displayed on all four walls. On the largest wall was a big picture of Noah's Ark with lots of animals. As our son got older, we would point to images on the wall as we read bedtime stories to him. Our son is now in his 20's and living several hours from us, so those days are far behind in our rearview mirror of life.

We prepared quite a lot for his birth. When our next two children were born, the preparation time had decreased significantly. Most parents know what I am talking about. The newness of your first-born brings with it so much emotion that you are compelled to spend countless hours preparing. When the next children are born, you are certainly excited, but you act differently and with a little more reserve.

For most readers, this is not your first Advent. It probably won't be your last. If you approach these December days simply as a way to prepare for Christmas, you may find yourself just doing the same old thing as last year. However, if you spend this time reflecting on the time when Jesus returns or when you shall see him face-to-face, you might be able to stir up some of that emotion of anticipation within you. Jesus *is* coming again. When people of all ages understand that reality, it can be a cause for large, wide-open eyes indeed.

Christmas

Ouestion:

With Christmas fast approaching, can you give me some practical tips to prepare myself and my family that will help us stay grounded in what this holiday is really about? With all the commercialism, it's easy to stray.

Answer:

Happy times and events bring fond memories and a renewed sense of love and kinship with others. The anticipation is half the joy of the event itself. The coming of the Lord is that kind of event that people have been looking forward to for generations with fervent hope and desire. It gave them strength and courage as they waited for the coming of the Lord.

We know that Christmas is rushed. Sales begin in August and carols blare long before the season begins. Everyone laments the commercial aspects of the season, but as Advent begins, do something to help you be more mindful of the Lord's coming. Use an Advent wreath, or enthrone the Bible prominently, or read the readings from the Bible assigned to each day. Postpone the tree and decorations until closer to Christmas. Establish new family rituals, customs and prayers that help remind everyone that we are preparing to celebrate the birth of Jesus. Fasting, daily Mass, a special celebration of reconciliation, reaching out to those alienated from family or society, and visiting the homebound manifest the love of the Christ Child and the Holy Family. Resist the temptation to rush the season. In his own time and in his own way, God will come. Our task is simply to be watchful and ready.

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
