

STATIONS OF THE CROSS FRIDAYS DURING LENT

At St John's after the 9:00 am Masses At St. Ann's — 7:00 PM My Dear Friends in Christ,

Last week we saw a Jesus that jarred us, one who was not the "warm and fuzzy Jesus" of whom I referred with regards to



my seminary training and of whom we often think when we picture who Jesus is for us. Last week, in the rendering of the Beatitudes, Luke presented a Savior who was not afraid to challenge people's thinking on who was of value in society (poor/rich, hungry/full, weeping/happy. This week's gospel presents Jesus as one who is once again not afraid to defy "conventional wisdom" on the ideas of love and forgiveness.

In today's gospel, which comes on the heels of last week's gospel passage, Jesus tells the listener/reader that for one to be considered a follower of Jesus, one cannot merely live their lives by the dictates of the world. If one is to be a follower of Jesus, one must "rise above the fray" and think (and act) differently than the world – in essence, one must be BETTER than the world. This should not be a radical thought to the Christian, for while we live *in* the world we should never live so much of the world that we forget why we are here. We are here, Jesus and the Church would tell us, to build up the Kingdom here on earth so that one day we may live in God's Eternal Kingdom. If we are to do this, we must think/act differently. Thus, Jesus speaks of us to "love your enemies...bless those who curse you..." (Lk 6:27-28) and "turn the other cheek" (Lk 6:29, paraphrased), among other things. This is challenging because it makes us seem weak, like "doormats". Quite the contrary, these challenges make us strong – not in the eyes of the world, but in the eyes of God. When we realize that our strength is in God, we are truly free to be the people who God calls us to be, and our "reward will be great" (Lk 6:35).

I realize that when one reads this, one can be disheartened because to live up to these standards can seem impossible. We are reminded in scripture, however, that "with God all things are possible" (Mt 19:26). Our reliance must be on God if we are to "succeed" in living the Christian life. We cannot live as the world lives, even while we live in the world, for our ultimate destiny isn't the world – it's the Kingdom. May we strive to live as "Kingdom People". May we continue to live as Jesus would call us to live, even/especially when it is difficult. May we trust the Lord's promise that He would not leave us abandoned, that He would be with us until the end of the end of time as we know it here on Earth.

<u>Cardinal O'Malley's statement on defrocking of</u> <u>Archbishop McCarrick</u>

Today Pope Francis rendered as final and irrevocable the recent decision by the Congregation of the Doctrine of the Faith to dismiss former Archbishop Theodore McCarrick from the clerical state. This action by the Holy Father is important in administering justice for the crimes and sins committed by the former Archbishop.

The seriousness of the final dismissal notwithstanding, it cannot in and of itself provide healing for those so terribly harmed by the former Archbishop's scandalous violations of his ministry or for their families. Also, the Holy Father's action by itself will not bring about the healing needed in the Catholic community and our wider society; both are justifiably appalled and outraged that the former Archbishop could have for so long inflicted harm on minors and young adults vulnerable in the life of the Church.

As leaders for the Church, as cardinals and bishops, we are rightfully judged by our actions and not our words. Sincere apologies and petitions for forgiveness must be part of the healing process but standing alone they ring hollow in light of the revelations of sexual abuse by clergy that have come forth during the past year and almost twenty years prior. Leadership in the Church must enforce accountability for cardinals and bishops if we hope to have the opportunity to engage the laity in the work of tangible change in the Church.

In the Archdiocese of Boston there are strong policies and procedures to protect our people and as best possible prevent any occurrence of abuse and we carefully monitor compliance. All allegations of abuse of a minor are immediately reported to law enforcement. The Archdiocese provides ongoing pastoral and medical care for survivors of sexual abuse for as long as needed. We hold these commitments and continual vigilance to be our moral responsibility and can never allow for complacency. With the help of God and each another may we be faithful to this most sacred trust.


LENTEN SACRIFICE PROJECT

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

February 24, 2019 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

I sometimes spend more money than I should. I make decisions based upon my wants and not my needs. Those actions can create a financial difficulty or circumstance where more sacrifice is needed. Instant gratification or selfish impulses can create havoc in one's bank account, marriage, or family. All these issues to deal with simply because I wanted what I wanted and I got it. Yes, it sounds like the actions of a child.

However, I know I am not alone. We all can easily find ourselves acting in this manner. This is why it struck me to listen once again to the words of Jesus when he says, "Do to others as you would have them do to you." The words are reminiscent of another of Jesus' phrases, "Love your neighbor as yourself." The problem is that too often I would like for others to fulfill my wants instead of needs, and I can seemingly love myself by doing what I already mentioned above.

A stewardship way of life means that I wisely steward what I have, and I cannot give what I do not have. Have you ever given someone a present you couldn't afford and think that was love? It wasn't. We don't show love by giving what we do not possess. We show love by meeting another's needs and by sharing our very self with them. At our core, what we long for from others more than anything else is love. Would I have others give me lavish gifts and shower me with empty compliments or would I have them give to me something much more valuable: the love in their hearts? In turn, I need to love myself more by realizing that no purchase will offer fulfillment more than the love of God shown to me in Christ Jesus.
