

My Dear Friends in Christ,



I love going to the movies; it's one of my great

"passions". I especially enjoy getting there in time for the "coming attractions", the previews of movies that will be released. It is there that I begin to "pick and choose" what movies I'm going to see and what ones I'm going to avoid. It is in today's gospel that we have a "preview" of something to come, something to which we can look forward.

In today's gospel, the Transfiguration is "front and center". This moment in salvation history is seen by Peter, James and John, and is "seen" by those of us who have "eyes" (in the spiritual sense) to see. When this moment happens, the three disciples who are with Jesus are not seeing things clearly. This is understandable due to the fact that they (nor anyone else) had never seen anything like this, nor had anyone else. They were fearful and confused, but in some sense they trusted that the Lord had their best interest at heart; He had never led them astray, and wasn't about to here. They fell silent because no words could convey the power of that moment.

Lent is for us a time of reflection. Lent for us is a time of conversion. Today's gospel is, for all who have eyes to see and ears to hear, a moment of reflection and conversion as well. We reflect on the fact that in this moment of the Transfiguration, Jesus shows to us not only who it is He will become, but also who it is that *we* will become. When we believe in the power and presence of Jesus, we ourselves are "transfigured" – made anew as new creations of God's love and power; this must be for us a moment of reflection and conversion. We reflect on the love which Jesus has for us in showing us the way to the Kingdom. We are converted in the sense that it is a moment of renewal for us in being shown who it is that we will become.

May we use this moment of reflection and conversion to deepen our commitment to Christ and His Church. May we come to see Jesus for who He is for us. May we come to believe that in the transfigured Christ, we have our hope and salvation. May this Lenten Season be a time of reflection and conversion, so that when Easter comes, Jesus may find us watching, waiting and ready to welcome Him anew.



According to the *Confessio* of Patrick, when he was about 16, he was captured by Irish pirates from his home in Britain and taken as a <u>slave</u> to Ireland, looking after animals; he lived there for six years before escaping and returning to his family. After becoming a cleric, he returned to northern and western Ireland. In later life, he served as a bishop, but little is known about the places where he worked. By the seventh century, he had already come to be revered as the patron saint of Ireland.

<u>Saint Patrick's Day</u> is observed on 17 March, the supposed date of his death. It is celebrated inside and outside Ireland as a religious and cultural holiday. In the dioceses of Ireland, it is both a <u>solemnity</u> and a <u>holy day</u> <u>of obligation</u>; it is also a celebration of Ireland itself.
